To receive the Clerks report.

- 1) Highways have confirmed that as normal 2/3 grit bags will be placed on the normal positions on the Webbington Rd for the winter period.
- 2) The Chairman had a call from Nick Wall of Southwest Heritage to advise that he considered It best if the Cross Mile Post be returned to its original position on the A38 as a grade 2 listed structure of historical interest. Subject to their current work load it is hoped to return It to the roadway before Christmas.
- 3) Speed watch Group It was agreed that the Clerk to speak to the Chair on his return to consider setting up a separate section of the website to record the good work being done by the speed watch group as well as other volunteers and groups that help the parish.

To receive the County Councillor report.

Read out by the Clerk from a report from Councillor Filmer.

Register to vote: Residents are being urged to check their electoral registration details or risk losing their chance to vote on decisions that affect them. Letters have gone out to an initial 83,000 houses across the County and all other households will be written to later this month. Residents can tell the Council of changes and if there are new people eligible to be registered at their address, they will receive an 'invitation to register form' either through the post (or via email, if this contact method has been provided).

Go Green grants: 'Go Green Scheme' and the 'Somerset Green Business Grant Scheme' are being introduced to offer businesses help and financial support to reduce energy consumption and carbon emissions. The scheme offers free energy audits and support to develop individual, costed and prioritised sustainability plans. Grants can be capital and/or revenue and fund up to 50% of total eligible project costs, with the remainder funded by the applicant. The scheme is now open for applications for activity and expenditure which must be completed by end of March 2024. The deadline for submission is 31st October. Further information is available

Plastics recycling: Every piece of plastic Somerset Council collected from households and via the recycling sites last year was recycled in the UK. In total 6,500 tonnes of plastic bottles, pots, tubs and trays all went to UK

companies to be turned into new products and packaging – everything from plastic wrapping and compost bins to fleece jackets. The figure is up from 99.4% the previous year.

Hosting: Autumn sees the return to university or college for many young people in Somerset, often leaving parents or carers with a sense of longed for peace and quiet. For others, a spare room gathering clutter and dust may also be ripe for a sort out and some useful employ. Hosting could be the answer, as the need continues for more host families to help support Ukrainian nationals forced to flee their homes and seek sanctuary in a new and unfamiliar setting. Since the Homes for Ukraine scheme was launched in March 2022, Somerset has welcomed over 1,500 Ukrainians to date, with host families playing a pivotal role in creating a safe environment for guests to re-settle and rebuild their lives in some way, supporting and helping them navigate a new life in the UK. BT prosecuted: British Telecommunications (BT) has been fined for carrying out work on Somerset's highway network without adequate traffic management or a valid street works permit. The utility firm was fined £12,000 and ordered to pay costs of £3,158, plus a £2,000 victim surcharge by Taunton Magistrates after it pleaded guilty to offences.

## 23/10l Safe Pathway Campaign Cross Lane – update on any progress with Axbridge Town Council and the Landowners.

Axbridge Town Council will not approach the landowners concerned until there is a detailed plan in place for set-up and for on-going maintenance including costs and responsibility. It was agreed to investigate the cost of upgrading the footpath with farm stock proof fencing along with using a base for the path such as gravel. This would then allow for the project to move forward. There is the possibility of grants that are available from other sources which could be investigated to help fund the project.

The Clerk to advise Axbridge Town Council that Compton Parish are looking to prepare a Plan which may help to persuade the landowners to co-operate with the project.

### 23/10J Update on the cost of obtaining an Electric Strimmer and spare battery.

Quotations were considered and it was agreed to purchase an EGO strimmer at £410 Including a spare battery which was the most competitive quote. This type of strimmer Is used by another local parish council very successfully. The servicing of the machine can also

A decision to be made on where the Strimmer will be stored to be decided once it has been purchased.

- 23/10K Church Lane Bus Shelter update on the progress of installing a bench.
  This is progressing and will be updated at the next meeting.
- New Replacement Sign on Wall at The New Inn to comply with the Yellow Lines on the road Cllr McCarthy obtained a quotation along with a printout of a suitable sign at a cost of £30. The cost and wording of the sign was sanctioned by the councillors although it was agreed that as a matter of courtesy to seek permission from the owner of the building before it is put up.
- Village Signs any progress on the "Cross Village" sign at the Compton Bishop end of the Village.

  This is still in progress and will be updated at the next meeting.
- 23/10N Springfield Wildlife Site update and to consider title of the volunteer group.

The management plan is still with Somerset Council for their approval as a few minor queries still need to be resolved.

The small team that will be carrying out the Management Plan have suggested that their title Should be "The Springfield Working Group" and this was unanimously agreed by all the Councillors present.

  The Council received the annual letter Crook Peak Community Magazine asking for a donation towards their printing costs. It was approved to allow the usual donation of £250 and the Clerk will inform the treasurer of the magazine accordingly.
