- The local development plan couple of workshops and consultations have been put
 out to the community councils that don't seem to be too affective this time. This
 needs to be looked at a bit more in terms of policy
 The master plan has fallen apart a bit and there needs to be greater vision for these
 plans. Margins now for developers are very tight. The next phase will be bids for
 where landowners and planners wish for development to take place
- 10% for council tax brings in 16 million for Aberdeenshire Council
 Integrated joint board last year was 11 million (they do not know what it will be this year) council cannot afford to keep bailing them out
