3 3.1 3.2	Matters Arising Fairy Glen. HA reported that the RSPB had now updated their website to clarify that the core path from the car park is closed due to a landslide. MMM to discuss signage at top gate with RSPB, suggesting that walkers return via the glen footpath rather than using the road which is extremely dangerous for pedestrians. The FRCC is concerned that there will be a serious accident. Feddon Hill playpark. JP said that she had linked up residents who had expressed an interest in improving the site. JP to pass on names to KW who has other potential volunteers in mind.	MMM JP/KW
4.4.1	Points from the public/correspondence Fortrose Union FC Fun Day. LR updated the meeting on plans regarding a football fun day which would also raise money for the charity Mikeysline on Saturday 24th August at the King George Memorial Field in Fortrose. The organisers are keen for local charities and organisations to take a stall (FRCC will have one) to make the event enjoyable for all ages and raise the profile of local groups. It was agreed that FRCC should share the club's facebook posts to encourage applicants (JP to contact Lucy Tonkin to request). JP to pass on useful contacts to LR. Mercat Cross. The remains of the historic mercat cross in Fortrose had been damaged in an incident of vandalism. A letter of apology from the perpetrators has been received. 8	Licensing Nothing to report. HA asked if a CC's statutory duty was solely regarding alcohol/entertainment and not, for example, holiday let licensing. TS to advise next meeting.	TS
9 9.1	Community issues/consultations Coastal erosion. MMM confirmed that THC had no further protection work planned for this year. HA enquired about blue paint on the Marine Terrace seawall and asked if it related to work by THC roads department. HA to send pictures to MMM. HA also expressed concerns regarding the state of the gabions between the burn and the Beach Cafe. AP/RAA to advise HA (on RAA behalf).	HA/MMM AP/HA
9.2	Common Good. Report sent from AP. The working group has requested the last three years' itemised accounts with breakdown of large payments from THC. Large-scale map of CG land produced. Seeking valuations for paintings. Full report next meeting.	
9.3	Chanonry Point. KW said that replicating last year's successful Accessibility Day would depend on ranger/council support. The most likely date for an event would be Saturday, 27th July 2024, further details to follow. MMM said that Shane Manning (Roads, THC) has agreed that someone will be sent by THC to manage parking. KW said that the Golf Club's help in moving mats for wheelchairs was essential last year. More volunteers would be sought to help move them back at the end of the day. The footpath to the Point will need strimming: a working group of volunteers will be sought if THC cannot help. Human waste, unfortunately, is still a major issue at the Point. MMM recognised the seriousness of the problem and said that options for ranger/parking officers for the summer are being explored. Requests for permission to install memorial benches at the Point are still being received despite no prospect of permission. JP wondered if relatives seeking to commemorate a loved one could be encouraged to pay for memorial paving stones or similar which could be both attractive and practical. MMM to investigate.	MMM
9.4	Traffic/parking. TS noted that Highland Broadband works are still causing some disruption across the Black Isle, and that campervans were starting to arrive in numbers. KW asked if traffic wardens ever attended our area, given recent problems with parking/buses in Rosemarkie. JP enquired regarding yellow line marking. Sign-up sheets for older residents who would like to attend are in local shops, details on FRCC Facebook page (or contact the FRCC via email or text). Musicians will attend. AP arranging catering, JP school volunteers. St Boniface Fair subgroup has met again and planning has progressed - including bookings for stalls and street entertainment, Historic Enviornment Scotland has been contacted re Cathedral access etc. JP to link AP with MMM re more potential stallholders. 11.2 11.3	Information boards. TS noted the information board at Chanonry Point was very weather-worn. JP said the condition of the board in Cathedral Square was also very poor. Discussion next meeting regarding repair/replacement/removal. FRCC postbox in Library. BL to install. School bus stop. MMM said there are concerns regarding the safety of the school bus drop-off point in Rosemarkie. THC is proposing to move the drop-off to the layby by the Slog. There is also concern over the size of vehicles used for deliveries to the Spar shop. THC investigating. Slog footpath. JP relayed information from AP regarding the	BL

11.5	footpath on the Slog in Rosemarkie. Improvements to the path have not been carried out due to a lack of clarity regarding ownership of the land. A resident has now paid for a land ownership search and has established that the land is in fact owned by THC. JP to contact Cllr Sarah Atkin to encourage action by THC. Station Road car park, Fortrose. MMM said that THC estimates that it will cost £200,000-£250,000 to resurface and reline -money that THC does not have. One option would be to charge for parking, with money raised split between car park improvement and the local community (eg RAFT to run the nearby public toilets). It is proposed that this could be "an invitation to pay" which has been surprisingly effective elsewhere. It was agreed that this option should be explored if the result was a well-planned car park with clear bays and entrance/exit marked. MMM to discuss with THC. Regarding campervans using the Rosemarkie Mill Lane car park (especially overnight, or parking across two bays), JP asked if a height restriction bar would help prevent abuse or would conservation issues prevent this? MMM to investigate. Community Council furniture. BL agreed to liaise with BI Men's Shed regarding repairs to antique "Burgh Council" furniture in the Black Isle Leisure Centre meeting room.
