- 3. MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD ON Tuesday 15th September Minutes were agreed.

5. SELMAN PARK

Review of current use of the facilities by Heddon St Andrews – It was decided to document the role played by Heddon St Andrews in the upkeep of the park and return to this point when more info was available.

Review of potential future use of facilities. It was decided that prices for external users of the field would differ according to their use of the field and that fees would be nominal to cover upkeep costs.

6. MAINTAINING OUR VILLAGE FOR ALL

Prices Memorial Park/Chare Bank paths update on drainage plan. – Mr keller has had difficulty in contacting Mr Fish regarding the drainage plan, he will copy in councillor Jackson for help. The pruning/planting plan from volunteers was agreed subject to costs for stump removal.

No resistance from relevant residents regarding plans to thin tree plantation next to MUGA, information only this is going ahead.

New quotes to obtain/review for MUGA resurfacing, this is likely in the region of £20k, discussion on use of resources for this. - Due to the approximate cost of the type of surface required this will have to go out to tender. **LP to check process MK to provide specification of work.**

Ideas for new play equipment in the Welfare Field, north side to replace existing dated swings and recently removed climbing frame. Discuss use of south side, picnic tables and seating, more children's equipment, other ideas? Drainage will require attention. Councillors were asked to prepare their thoughts for fuller discussion at the next meeting. Councillor volunteer as library liaison and new members of the finance committee x 2, planning committee x 1, residents association x 1, volunteer x1. – Mr Adams volunteered for the finance committee, Mrs Irving Munro planning committee, Mr Keller for liaison with the residents association

NCC extra grass cuts 2021/22 £690.56 plus VAT for decision. This was left for decision outside the meeting.

7. IMPROVING OUR VILLAGE FOR ALL

PJ to progress road markings at bus stop Hexham Road has been unable to do this due to a long term car abandoned at the bus stop. **LP to report**. Passing places East Heddon Road this has been raised as part of the 3 priorities and the Local Transport Report. Ongoing issues with a lack of tree cutting on the slip road - the NCC officer in charge has stated that this will be done before Christmas. permission to improve trees between bus stop/garage B6582 (see below), permission to mount baskets on lamp posts and passing places east Heddon Road. LP to send Peter details of the issues and councillors to copy in Peter with All mails to NCC to ensure answering.

Progress of B6528 application for tree work. At the time of the meeting there was no update however before the minutes were produced agreement was received to go ahead. Facebook update This has now been handed over to Mrs Irving Munro who ran through lots of ideas i.e. competition for cover picture, calendars. Format of other PC pages was shown. Heddon PC website – Mr Knox was unavailable to discuss this point however LIM to contact him directly to link this in with the Facebook page. **LP to remove mention of foot and mouth.**

12. COUNTY COUNCIL UPDATE

The new school in Ponteland is opening on 2nd Nov the delays because of Covid 19 have been quite short with some of the materials being diverted to Nightingale Hospitals. The Council has also been prioritising roads with lots of works going on throughout the county Covid 19 cases are high in Newcastle but significantly lower in Northumberland with the hotspots being the areas nearer Newcastle and the Tyne Corridor going further into the county the numbers drop significantly. The dash board on the County Council website www.northumberland.gov.uk gives updated daily info on cases drilling down to a ward level.

Peter was asked if all the county workers were back or if some were still on furlough, they are all back but may are still working from home.

13. ANY OTHER BUSINESS

Knott hall was featured in the Hexham Courant but were misquoted regarding use of their grant. This has now been rectified by the paper. One of the councillors stressed the need for an outdoor tap.

Armistice Day wreath laying ceremony – Due to Covid 19 restrictions this ceremony is unable to go ahead. A notice will be provided giving full information very soon encouraging people to Remember from Home to observe the silence and lay any wreaths or memorials at times to suit themselves while practising social distancing if anyone else is in the park. This decision has been taken in conjunction with the church and was made with deep regret.
