Voter ID

Voters need to show photo ID to vote at polling stations in the upcoming General Election.

You can check if you're registered to vote by contacting your local Electoral Registration Office online website. elections@northumberland.gov.uk

You can also check if you have accepted photo ID or for any queries please contact the Elections office on 01670 624811 or at the above Northumberland County Council website:

There is not yet a deadline for registering to vote but the deadline is typically 12 working days before the election, which will be June 18th. The deadline is likely to be June 19th for a postal vote.

You must apply for a proxy vote at least two weeks before election day.

A Place for Everyone

Our morning service on a Sunday is now at 10.30 a.m. This means that Revd. Rachel can lead more Sunday services at St. Andrew's which is a great blessing.

We are continuing to hold joint services with the Methodist Church several times a year alternating between St. Andrew's and the Methodist Church – details will appear in the church email and in our Heddon Gossip articles.

Meetings to plan the Culture Festival at the end of August are in full swing and everyone is welcome to attend these meetings at St. Andrew's Church.

On 24th April, there was a meeting to discuss the future of children's activities in the churches of Heddon. We have decided to plan three events this year. There will be two 'Are You Teddy Ready' events, 22nd June and 6th July 10am-12 noon at the Methodist Church. These are Coffee and Juice mornings where people, especially children, can come along and learn how to make their own teddy bear for the teddy bear parachute, that will take place at the closing event at the Culture Festival. The third event will be an Advent Journey 10am-12 noon 30th November at St. Andrew's Church and we will have crafts and activities to guide us through the journey of Advent, Christmas and beyond.

As the weather has improved we have had some maintenance work done in the Church grounds. The gates and railings have been repainted and look very nice.

Also, a potentially serious problem with the church roof is to be investigated in May.

A Coffee Morning held in May, raised funds for the annual Christian Aid appeal. We are grateful to all those who attended and for the selection of delicious cakes and scones which were provided.

On D Day, **6**th **June at 6.30pm**, we hope to ring the church bells to symbolize our desire for Peace in the world.

If you would like to be part of the 'ringing team', please inform the vicar or a churchwarden or any member of St. Andrew's PCC. We will draw up a Rota for bell ringers to mark the occasion.

On 30th **June.** All five churches in our group are invited to meet at St. Mary's Church, Stamfordham 10.30am for shared worship. Everyone is welcome to come along.

14th July is our next shared worship with our friends from the Methodist Church in Heddon. The service is at the usual time of 10.30 a.m. On this occasion, the service will be at St. Andrew's Church.

At the end of July I will be moving on, as I retire (or 'Sit down' as an active minister, as we say in the Methodist Church) so although it is still 10 weeks away, I just wanted to say 'thank you' to all in Heddon, who have made me feel part of the place, greeted me as we've met on the streets and included me in your village life. I've not been here very long – just two years - but I have come to know some lovely people here, and feel blessed to have been able to end my working life in such a beautiful part of the country. I will have fond memories of some of the activities that happen here, of the Hadrian's Wall Festival (2 years ago this was just taking place as I arrived!) and the Heddon Show, of village Remembrance Days, of Christmas Celebrations, of various gatherings in the Knott Hall and at St Andrew's Church (as well as at the Methodist Church), and of some of the school activities which I've been able to attend.

But what makes it all special is of course the people and the friendliness and love that you people in the North East have shown to me. I will miss you. As I move on, I pray that you will continue both to be blessed, and to be a blessing to all who visit or come to live in your village.

In May we held our Annual Electors Meeting. The full minutes of the meeting will be shared, but here's an overview of what we've achieved in the last year.

There has been a couple of changes in the Parish Council membership, as Paul (former Chair who has been supporting my first year as Chair) has now stepped down fully and Dan Matthews has joined us. The council are all volunteers and as Chair I'm very grateful for the time and expertise they bring to the council. The

same goes for all of those who volunteer across the village. It doesn't go unnoticed, and I hope you all appreciate how much your contribution means.

We have sub committees to support the delivery of our projects.

 the planning committee provides feedback on applications, review letters from residents all working to maintain the character of our village. Northumberland County Council has the final decision on any planning issues.

Our Mission

Statement:

our staffing committee looks after the two paid members of staff who keep the Parish Council rolling on a day by day basis. We look after their welfare, work objectives and development. A huge thanks to Lorraine our Assets Officer and Lucy our Clerk.

Alongside the general maintenance of the village and upkeep of our assets, we also work on project to improve the village. This year we've achieved;

- the 'Sponsor a Tree' project for trees planted in the Memorial Park and Welfare Field
- Roman Herb Garden procurement and sourcing of plants and herbs for garden beds
- Proposals over the future use of Selman Park
- Working collaboratively with St Andrew's Church to explore options once graveyard is full
- Exploring 'Warm Hub' arrangements, working with local Churches, Knott Hall, WI and businesses
- Library boiler replacement project.
- Hadrian's MOSAIC installation ongoing maintenance once in place on the Bridleway

We've continued to respond to urgent health and safety requirements following Storm Arwen and have assessed the remaining trees across the village taking action where needed. We've also supported the repairs at the Knott Hall and the damaged wall on Chare Bank. We've worked in collaboration with Northumberland County Council and number of key stakeholders to ensure this work and the resurfacing works we completed in collaboration. This has also reduced the flooding at the Chare Bank entrance of the Memorial Park.

This year we will be focusing on improvements in the Welfare Field and improvements in the Memorial Park. Some of these are linked to health and

safety, some from feedback across the Parish and some general maintenance and upkeep of our spaces.

We're also pleased that the precept has been maintained at same level for the 3rd year running.

In line with our governance and financial requirements, we continue to be audited on an annual basis and share details of our financials both in the annual reports alongside the guidance for sharing the annual audited accounts. These are always made available the notice boards.

The governance and finance is monitored through all members of the Parish Council as it's part of the regulations that we, all councillors sign up to. Year on year we strengthen our governance and audit supported by Councillor Michael Wilson who is a specialist in this area. It helps us to be transparent in the work that we're taking forward. Our approach to projects has been a good example of this to make that we're futureproofing the decisions that we're making.

We've supported the Village Show and the Culture Event through our grants and donation scheme. We are also trying to reignite and support the use of Selman Park. This as of yet has had little traction and we're hoping that this changes so that we can warrant keeping this asset within the village.

The business centre, which not only enables the village to continue to run a library service, provides income to our village to support other projects. We've had some changes in the tenants over the past year, but are glad that the business centre is once again full.

The Parish Council continues to collaborate with a number of stakeholders regarding the speeding concerns in the village as well as parking. Although we work on these at every meeting, again these areas are controlled by various departments of Northumberland County Council, so progress is slow. This is as frustrating for us as a council as well as for those of you in the village who raise your concerns.

On March 25th we hosted our Annual General Meeting, the chance to quiz the Trustees, check out the plans for the Hall, perhaps even become involved.

Yet again it would appear that there is little interest in the Knott Memorial Hall. The attendance of 2 residents was at least double that of last year and that one was prepared to become involved in the running of the Hall was surprising.

88 years ago, the Hall was donated to the village by a family who had a deep-rooted affection for the village and its residents, hoping that the Hall would be a focal point for improving the life of all who resided there. The World had just been through the Trauma of War and was about to be consumed by another war. The gift being seen as an anchor for the village. So much so that when it was taken by Government and Council, the village put up a valiant fight to get it back, which was ultimately successful.

Perhaps that anchor has gone, whilst the Trustees struggle to maintain the structure and endeavour to fulfil the designs of the Trust deed, it would appear that some residents have little desire or affection for their village hall.

Nature Notes

Identifying and recording wildlife

Ruth Oatway

In a change to my usual format I'm not focusing on a particular species this time. Instead here's a brief overview of some of the mobile phone apps and websites now available to help you identify wildlife and record what you see. These are really useful tools in addition to traditional field guide books and a great way to get started or add to what you already know.

Mobile phone apps to help with the identification of plants, fungi and animals can be quick and convenient to use, especially when you're out and about. Some use artificial intelligence to suggest the identity of a species from a photo, like Google lens but specifically for wildlife so likely to give more reliable results. While apps can provide a helpful pointer and are often correct, they can also make mistakes so don't accept the ID without question. It's a good idea to cross-reference a species suggestion with other sources and check that key features match. Also check whether an app is UK-specific or can be set for European or UK species only. This will narrow down the suggestions and increase the chances of a correct ID. Here are a couple of examples to try:

- **Merlin** (birds only). This widely-used app now has both a UK and European 'bird pack'. It can help identify a bird species from a photo but a really useful feature is that it can also recognise birds from their calls.
- **Seek** can be used to identify both plants and animals. It's good for kids as you can earn badges and take part in challenges.

Some apps not only help you identify a species but also make it easy to submit your sightings to a national recording scheme. This is a really valuable way to contribute to scientific understanding of the natural world. Accessible wildlife information allows better decisions to be made about the environment based on the best and most up-to-date evidence.

In the UK two of the most popular tools for recording across all wildlife groups are **iNaturalistUK** and **iRecord**. Records added to either system can become available to National Recording Schemes, Local Environmental Record Centres and the NBN Atlas, the UK's largest collection of biodiversity data.

• **iNaturalistUK** - an easy-to-use website and app, which gives help with identification and allows you to upload your photo and sighting

information in the same place. Data you submit to iNaturalistUK will also be shared with iRecord (see below)

• **iRecord** – a website and app that brings wildlife records from many sources into one place to be checked and verified before being made available to a wider audience for research and conservation. iRecord works best if you have already identified the species you are recording.

A box for donations to the **Newcastle Foodbank** is located outside the **side door of the Methodist Chapel.** The contents of the box are taken regularly to the Foodbank warehouse at Lemington. They are **gratefully received.**

Why do people need to use the Foodbank?

One reason is this..... The basic rate of Universal Credit is only £85 a week for a single adult. But many people receive even less. This is because of deductions to Universal Credit payments. These deductions are made to pay back debt - but taking on this debt is often completely unavoidable.

For example, the five-week wait between applying for Universal Credit and receiving the first payment means that many people are forced to take out an advance loan from the government. To pay off these loans, money is automatically deducted from people's Universal Credit payments, leaving them even less able to afford the essentials.

Over half the people in receipt of Universal Credit when referred to Foodbanks are facing these deductions. They are made at the very moment when people most need help, leaving them facing impossible decisions.

So please donate if you feel it appropriate. These are the items most in demand at the moment.

- Tinned fruit
- Instant mash/tinned potatoes
- Baby milk and formula
- Toiletries (sanitary towels)
- Tea/coffee

- Soup tinned and packet
- · Custard and rice pudding

How planning permission practice for airport expansion ignores climate change. Airports around the UK want to expand, increase numbers of flights and passengers. As we've reported previously, aviation is hell-bent on expansion. Even though it contributes significantly to climate change already, it wants to increase the damage it's doing.

The UK government helps this all along with the way planning permission for airport expansion is handled. **So, how does this work?** Well, if you add up the climate and environmental impacts of all UK Airports, the effect is significant and concerning. An airport wanting to expand would only increase this overall effect. **BUT** the government has decreed that the impact of each airport expansion is to be assessed on its own so that the effect looks a lot smaller which means that applications for planning permission are easier to get past Net Zero and other environmental requirements.

Net Zero nonsense. Net Zero will happen when the amount of carbon we add to the atmosphere is no more than the amount removed. It needs to happen very soon but planetary progress on this has been pitiful so far and emissions of CO2 are climbing.

Carbon dioxide (CO2) is around 0.04% of the atmosphere. This tiny amount is critical to maintaining the planet at a stable, inhabitable temperature. Too little and we freeze, too much and we cook, it's a system in very fine balance. CO2 stays in the atmosphere for between 300 years and 1000 years. This means that what we've emitted in large volumes since the industrial revolution, especially in the last few decades, is not going away any time soon. As we add to it, we increase the effect it has in accelerating climate change. **The aviation industry wants to get to Net Zero by 2050.** This is far too late. and it won't get there at all if it expands as it hopes to.

In an emergency situation, which most climate scientists believe is where we are, we need to fly less, not more.




