Protect Your Pooch

next Parish Council meeting in July.

In response to the increased fear of pet theft, Neighbourhood Watch has recently launched a 'Protect Your Pooch' campaign.

To help keep your dog safe they have pulled together some tips to reduce your chances of becoming a victim of dog theft:

SECURE – Make sure garden boundaries are safe and outdoor kennels are locked and alarmed. IN SIGHT - Don't leave your dog outside shops, unattended in your car or out of sight on walks. SEARCHABLE – make sure your dog is microchipped and the details up to date. Take photos of your dog from different angles, showing any distinctive markings and also have photos of you with your dog to help prove ownership.
