Queen's Platinum Jubilee

In 2022, Her Majesty The Queen will become the first British Monarch to celebrate a Platinum Jubilee, seventy years of service, having acceded to the throne on 6th February 1952 when Her Majesty was 25 years old. An extended bank holiday, from Thursday 2nd to Sunday 5th June, will provide an opportunity for communities and people throughout the United Kingdom to come together to celebrate the historic milestone. The four days of celebrations will include public events and community activities, as well as national moments of reflection on The Queen's 70 years of service.

Our village community has celebrated previous jubilees so it seems fitting that we should organise an event to mark this landmark occasion. The Parish Council would like to hear suggestions from residents as to how we might best achieve this. We have no village community facilities so in the past have relied on the generosity of individuals or collaboration with the Parish Church to host such events. In July, we held a very successful benefice picnic with songs of praise on the lawn of the church grounds. Everyone enjoyed singing along to old favourite Hymns, and having the chance to catch up with friends in a safe manner.

In fact, the event went so well that many in attendance expressed that it would be nice to make it a regular thing.

Church attendance has been good and consistent, often filling 6 or 7 of the 8 spaces allowed. We are hopeful that a review in September will increase capacity.

We are planning a harvest service at 5pm on Sunday 26th September to be held outside, and a good array of harvest songs and hymns will be included for all to sing. Please bring a chair and broly in case of inclement weather.

As with all services we are still required to take bookings and observe previous lockdown rules (mask wearing inside the church, sanitising on entry etc.) All services are subject to Government Guidance and Church of England regulations. Services are currently held at 6pm every Sunday evening, but these are under review for September. All services are also advertised in the Church Weekly News Sheet. Pavement Obstruction


It's that time of year when hedges and shrubs are growing vigorously and are often in need of cutting back. This is particularly important if growth is overhanging the pavement, making it difficult to negotiate especially for those who are less infirm, visually impaired, mobility scooter users and anyone pushing a pram. The Parish Council is aware that there is stretch along Browns Lane on the 'railway land' which is encroaching onto the pavement and a letter has been sent to Network Rail to highlight the matter and ask for hedge trimming to take place.

Litter and Dog Poo Bins

During a discussion on the 'Nextdoor' social media site, the lack of dog poo bins on Browns Lane was highlighted. As a consequence, the Parish Council has agreed to fund another bin to be sited opposite the entrance to the church. This is subject to approval from Rushcliffe Borough Council. The Parish Council has also put in a request for a litter bin to be sited in the bus layby next to Brook Drive in the hope that this might reduce the amount of littering in that spot.

Village Signs

The village gateway signs have unfortunately been delayed by the Covid pandemic but we now have the final design which has been sent to the foundry. Hopefully it won't be too long before we can see them sited at the village gateways on the Melton Road and Stanton Lane.
