100th Birthday Celebration

As a result of the distribution of Queen's Birthday medals by the Parish Council, it came to our attention that Ivy Starkey, possibly Stanton's oldest resident, recently celebrated her 100th birthday with friends and family from far and wide, including her two remaining sisters. Here she is pictured with her Queen's Birthday medal which was presented by Mike Sheriston, Chairman of the Parish Council, her card from the Queen and a telegram from the Secretary of State for Work and Pensions. In the photo she is surrounded by daughter Pam, her two grandsons, her five great grandsons and her first great granddaughter.



Ivy (née Gregory) was born on 25th July, 1916 on Richmond Road, Donnington le Heath, Coalville. She was one of thirteen children, of whom only three remain.

Ivy left school at 14 and, along with being a nurse maid to her younger siblings, she took up employment at a boot and shoe factory in Earl Shilton and Shepshed.

Ivy married Bill Starkey in October 1937. During World War Two Ivy helped in Pegs munitions factory in Coalville until only daughter Pam arrived towards the end of the war. Bill and Ivy then ran a pub in Church Gresley followed by newsagents in Barwell and Braunstone.

Bill and Ivy were married for 68 years and, after his death, Ivy moved to Stanton on the Wolds to live with her only child, daughter Pam, and her son in law in December 2007.
