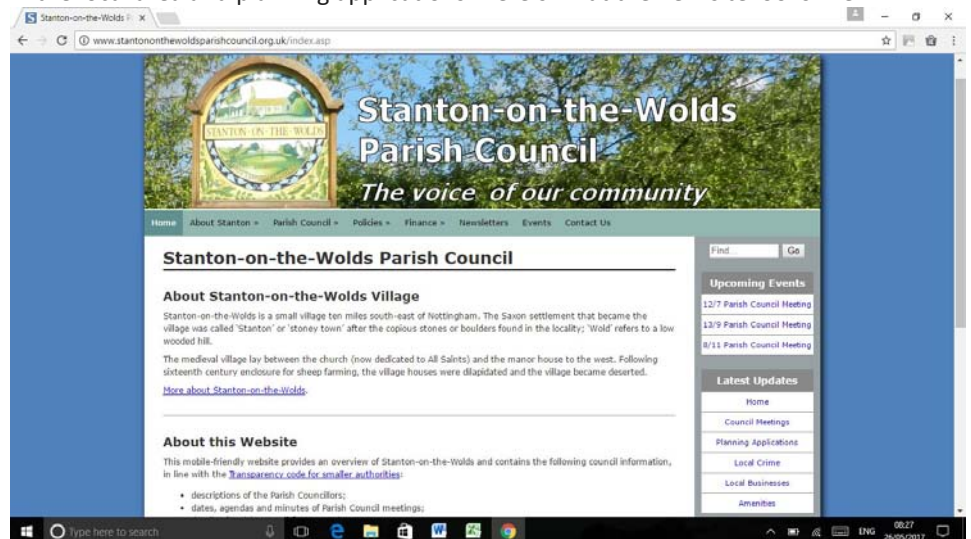

## Celebrations to mark the end of WW1

Residents in Stanton on the Wolds have been asked to make an early date in their diaries, for Sunday November 11 next year. The parish council has agreed to support a national event 'Battle's Over - A Nation's Tribute and WW1 Beacons of Light' which is taking place on Remembrance Day next year to commemorate the centenary of the ending of the First World War.

Pageantmaster Bruno Peek, after his successful nationwide event to mark the 90<sup>th</sup> birthday of Queen Elizabeth II, is now heading the arrangements for this event and already has over 400 villages countrywide signed up to an event which will include beacons and bonfires.

Says the organiser: "The beacons and bonfires are being lit at 7pm on November 2018 as part of an historic tribute to the many millions who were killed or came home dreadfully wounded during the war. It is also an opportunity to remember the huge army of men and women on the home front who, often in dangerous and exhausting conditions, underpinned the war effort - keeping the wheels of industry turning, bringing the harvests home and ensuring the nation did not starve."

Participants will also receive a complimentary copy of Battle's Over: A Nation's Tribute – 11th November 2018, the official publication of the Battle's Over national and international event, which concludes four years of First World War commemoration and remembrance.

The Parish Council would be grateful to learn of anyone in the parish who is a relative of someone who served their country in WW1 so they can be invited to light the beacon or attend the function as a special guest.

## St Cecilia Chorale

An appreciative audience was recently treated to an evening of entertainment by the St Cecilia Chorale. The concert took place at All Saints Church on Saturday 29<sup>th</sup> April, and featured a varied repertoire of songs from classical to jazz, in addition to poetry recitals and instrumental performances.



Alexandra Brooks, a member of the Chorale has given us the following information on this talented group:

*"June Corbett is the Conductor and founding member of the St Cecilia Chorale. In her singing career she was a Coloratura Soprano specialising in Mozart, Haydn and Puccini. June is now retired but loves to keep working with the St Cecilia Chorale. She has been involved with Stanton Church on and off since she was 10 years old. Raised in Stanton-on-the-Wolds, June was privately tutored, studying and gaining her ALCM (Associate of London College of Music) performers diploma. Subsequently she worked as a recital singer experienced in Leader, Oratorio, Musical Theatre and Musical Comedy in Spain, Italy, Holland and Majorca. She worked with students at MADDS (Midlands Academy of Dance, Drama & Singing) preparing them for three year courses for the West End from 1983 - 1993. June then founded the St Cecilia Singers (now Chorale). She taught singing and piano for beginners and many of the members of the St Cecilia group are students trained in singing by June."*

The St Cecilia Chorale will be performing on Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> July at All Saints Parish Church, as part of the Open Weekend (see above).
