# **Your Local Parish Council Needs You!**

Thursday May 2 will be Election Day in Stanton on the Wolds, if sufficient names are put forward, to seek a seat on the local parish council. The whole parish council as it stands currently will stand down as the six members end their term of office in April and new councillors will come into office after May 2.

If there are insufficient names put forward to make voting necessary, the names submitted will be considered elected. If more than seven names are put forward, an election will be held.

Rushcliffe Borough Council now has the necessary election packs available and completed papers have to be returned to them by 4pm on April 3. The packs are available from the Borough Council on line or can be obtained from the clerk, Mike Elliott.

It will be chaired by the Chairman of the Parish Council but it is <u>not</u> a parish council meeting and has a less formal format.

# **Local History**

Our local historians, Alan and Val Hunt have sent three more articles for inclusion in the history section of the village website. This time they've delved back to Stone Age, Roman and Medieval times.

Evidence of Stone Age activity has been found at several sites around the village and finds have included stone and flint axe heads, flint arrows, scrapers and borers.

Roman pottery sherds have also been found in the village, mostly in the Thurlby Lane area as in Roman times this was the route from the Fosse way to Plumtree.

An interesting Medieval find was a lead ampulla which would have held holy water or oil and been worn round the neck of a pilgrim. It was found near Stanton Church and was presumably dropped as the pilgrim made their way there.

# **Bryan Baines**

Bryan Baines sadly passed away in hospital on 7<sup>th</sup> February 2019.

Bryan and his wife Janet moved to Stanton in 1998 following Bryan's retirement. However their connections with the village go back much further than that as they moved into the house which had been owned by Janet's parents.

After moving into the village, Bryan joined the Parish Council, shortly afterwards becoming the Chairman. During his time as chairman, he oversaw several important events in village history – the presentation of Millennium silver spoons in 2000, the dedication of the village sign in 2001, the millennium party at Thurlby Farm, the Queen's Jubilee party and the June 2004 summer fair on the church field.

He retired from the Parish Council in 2015.

Bryan was also a member of the United Reform Church in West Bridgford, from where he ran the 3<sup>rd</sup> West Bridgford Scouts. He was a true gentleman who will be sadly missed by all who knew him.

A true matriarch of our community, Joan Hall, has sadly passed away suddenly on the 18th December 2018. Joan was a dedicated and long standing member of more than one local choir including that of the Keyworth Choir and The St. Cecilia Chorale. She demonstrated great skill as an alto, a brilliant pianist and sight reader. She pleasantly surprised her peers, colleagues and friends with the challenges that she was able to overcome and her endeavours to "keep calm and carry on". Joan was individual, independent and beautifully strong minded. She respected the friends around her and took musical instruction in her stride. She took a vested interest in the lives of her friends, young and older, often asking how things were going and politely requesting she be kept in the loop, Joan loved to be included and involved. Her wonderful charm and refreshingly bright personality will be dearly missed.

### Tree Warden

I'm sure we're all aware of the importance of trees to our environment so it's good news that Rushcliffe Borough Council is inviting volunteers to act as Tree Wardens for their parish.

Tree Wardens are volunteers appointed by their Parish Council to:

- Be a contact and support for all things tree related in their local area
- Protect trees by reporting on early signs of pests, disease and vandalism
- Gather information, survey and record information about trees important for wildlife and the heritage of the parish
- Help look out for opportunities to plant more trees in the local community, enhancing the environment for parishioners
- Help find money to fund local tree planting projects (e.g. The tree Council has grants only available for Tree Wardens)
- Get involved in campaigns to raise awareness about the importance of trees

Wardens will work closely with, and be supported by, the Parish Council, but don't need to be a Parish Councillor. There will be a meeting to introduce the Tree Wardens Scheme to prospective / nominated Tree Wardens at Rushcliffe Country Park on Saturday 13 April 2019 from 2pm – 5pm.
