Roy Henry Butler 6th February 1928 - 23rd December 2019

Roy Butler moved to Stanton-on-the-Wolds with his late wife Nora and son Richard in 1973. He soon became an active member of South Wolds School PTA where one of the other members was also a Stanton-on-the-Wolds parish councillor. He suggested that Roy would make an excellent councillor and as there was a vacancy, would he consider joining. Before long, Roy really took to the role and got fully involved with all aspects of village life. He became Chairman of the council for several years before retiring in 2011.

His work on the parish council also gave him an interest in the next level of local government, Rushcliffe Borough Council. Having retired from his career as a lecturer in 1988, he had more time to devote to parish and community matters, and he was elected to Rushcliffe Borough Council, representing the Wolds Ward, in 1991. He held onto this position until he decided to retire from it in 2011.

In 2000, he was honoured to be chosen to be Mayor of Rushcliffe where he carried out hundreds of civic engagements around the borough during the Millennium year.

Roy was also a key supporter of All Saints Church in the village, where for many years until his sudden passing just before Christmas, he was a member of the church parochial church council. Roy was also a talented artist, and there are numerous drawings and sketches of the church and other buildings that live on.

Away from councils, Roy loved living at his home on Melton Road, taking a particular interest in the garden and observing the multitude of wildlife.

He will be missed by his friends and colleagues and, of course, Richard.
