Speed and Flow Survey - VIA East Midlands have completed a Speed & Flow Survey which the Parish Council requested, on Stanton Lane. The results showed that 85% of vehicles exceeded the limit. Unfortunately the flow of traffic was lower than the threshold for an interactive speed sign to be put in by VIA East Midlands. More frequent monitoring visits from the local spend enforcement camera have been requested.

Crime Reporting - There are various ways to report a crime or safety concern. As well as 999 in an emergency, 101 can be used in a non-emergency situation and is answered for 24 hours. Things that can be reported on the 101 number are stolen property, property damage, drug use or dealing in the neighborhood and antisocial behaviour.

Nottinghamshire Fire & Rescue - Nottingham Fire & Rescue Service will make a “Safe & Well” visit to advise on any issues you may have. This is a free service which can be arranged by phoning 0115 8388100. Well worth considering if you have mobility or hearing concerns.
