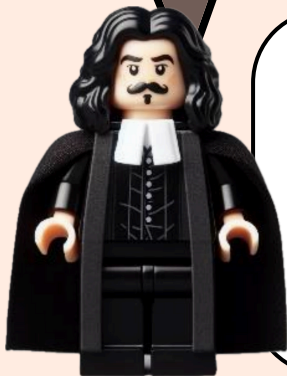


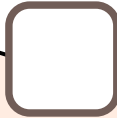

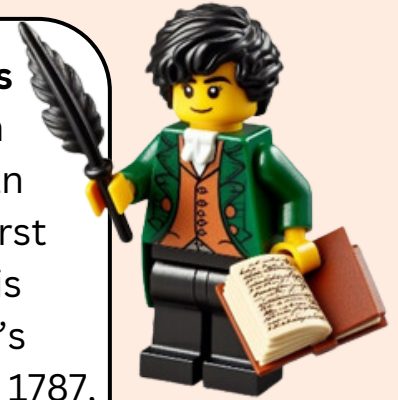
Robert Leighton

When he died in 1684 he left his books and money to build the Leighton Library in Dunblane



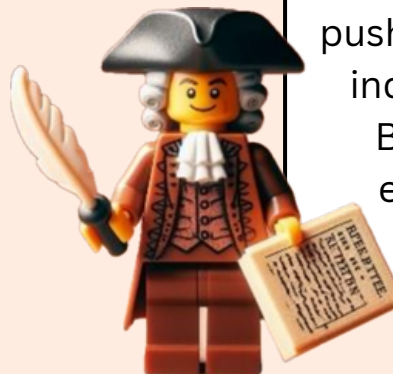
Robert Burns

The Leighton Library has an Edinburgh First Edition of this famous poet's poems, from 1787, when he visited Dunblane



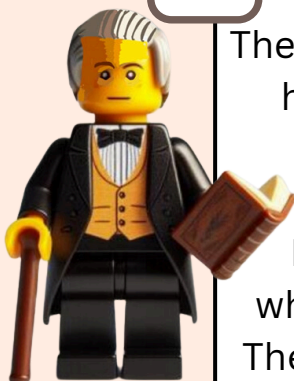
Thomas Paine

The Leighton Library has a 1791 edition of his "Common Sense" - pushing for American independence from Britain, and a 1792 edition of his "The Rights of Man"



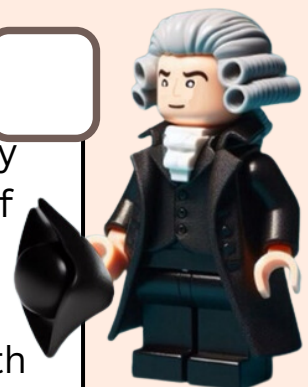
Sir Walter Scott

The Leighton Library has a First Edition from 1810 of his epic poem "The Lady of the Lake" which helped make The Trossachs a top tourist destination



Adam Smith

The Leighton Library has a First Edition of 1776 of "An Inquiry into the Nature and Causes of the Wealth of Nations" by this famous economist



Robert Adam

The Leighton Library has "Ruins of the palace of the Emperor Diocletian at Spalatro in Dalmatia" from 1764 by this famous architect and furniture designer

The Leighton Library has a 1554 edition of this famous map maker's atlas "Cosmographia"



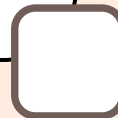
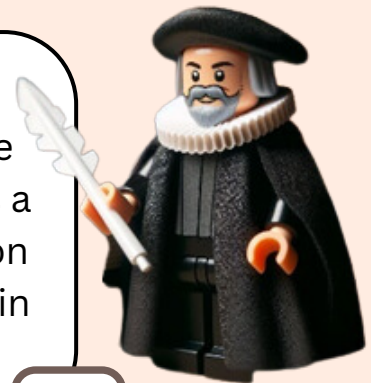
Captain James Cook

The Leighton Library has a 3-volume 1773 First Edition of this famous explorer and map-maker's "Account of the voyages undertaken for making discoveries in the Southern Hemisphere" and a 4-volume 1777 First Edition of his "Voyage round the world, performed in His Brittanic Majesty's ships the Resolution and Adventure"



Thomas à Kempis

The Leighton Library has a 1564 edition of his "De Imitatione Christi" (The Imitation of Christ). This is a small book in the Leighton Library. Robert Leighton carried it around with him, and made many notes in this book - in tiny handwriting for the tiny book!



Tobias Smollett

The Leighton Library has a First Edition of 1766 of "Travels through France and Italy" by Scottish surgeon, poet & famous author Tobias Smollett which he wrote after he'd been ill in 1763, and his only child had died aged just 15
