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ANNUAL PLAN SHOWING ACTIVITY SCHEDULE	Action
R Freel advised why we were looking for this as it would give an indication of who	
and when land services were in the village. Ian advised that if a team were	
allocated to the village it may not be required. Irrespective of this community	
council would like to see a plan of action for village. Given the request was received	
on Monday it was agreed that the community council allow a bedding in period.	
BREAKDOWN OF BUDGET SPEND	
Ian advised that he had not had time to provide this information as the agenda was	
only received on Monday, however this will be provided. A verbal detail of how	
spend was allocated was provided.	
PREVIOUS INSPECTIONS (PROVIDE SAMPLES FOR DISCUSSION)	
Again due to time this was not provided however it is only a visual inspection that is	
taken with a verbal report being feedback. R Freel asked how this was recorded	
and it was not. This is an area that will be looked at.	
PATH REPAIRS	Action
Path repairs if minor, they are funded from budget but larger repairs are capital	
expenditure and subject to internal bids for monies. The path at the Boags was	
discussed and Ian and Colin will speak to John Ferguson the forestry expert to find	
out if funding can be sought.	
Some discussion on the gap in the hedge and wall repairs. Gap will be looked at with	
a view to planting hedging.	
REPLACEMENT EQUIPMENT (PLAY, BINS, SEATS	Action
Similar to path repairs, minor can be dealt with from budget. Bins will be looked	
at as a quick fix as will seats. Bins are dual purpose as they can be used as dog	
fouling bins.	
RUNNING TRACK	ACTION
Maintenance of the running track area was discussed and this will be looked at,	
the community council felt that the chain fence was inadequate and that	
something else should be looked at deter quad bikes.	
CEMETERY	Action
Walls around cemetery were discussed as in need of repair. Reports had been	
prepared but budgets did not stretch as far. This will be re-looked at. Areas on	
walls for pointing etc were also raised as was the gate to the old cemetery and the	
turnstile.	
PATH TO BOAGS	Action
Discussed under path maintenance. Major repairs will be under capital or other	
funding.
