	The Community police officers were in attendance and gave the crime report for the village. The start of the report compared this year's statistics with the previous year e statistics for the village. Figures showed a 43% drop in youth disorder and a 59% drop in anti-social behaviour. The crime report for this month showed there were 53 incidents reported resulting in 12 crime reports being raised with 7 being detected. These included one person being detained in police custody for shoplifting having previously been warned about staying away from the premises. There were also three arrests for drug incidents of possession. There were 2 attempted break ins in Camnethan Street and Lockhart street. PC Freel also reported that following the previous complaints last month about speeding these had been passed to Inspector Bell at Larkhall who passed it onto the Traffic department.  PC Freel then issued blank Key Individual Network (KIN) survey questionnaires to all present at the meeting explaining the purpose of the questionnaire and asked all members of the community including the council to complete them about policing priorities for the village. He will then use the monthly Community Council meeting as a KIN Group and the areas with the highest number of responses would be treated as the priority policing areas for the next month with results being feedback to the community. Everyone agreed to take part in the anonymous survey.  Completed form were then collected  Chaired outlined the result of the Public counter review and read out the new times for Larkhall police station. Members of the public were reminded to use 101 for nonemergency calls but could still use the 999 for emergency. A member of the public asked for more police patrolling in the village.
