There had been 36 reported incidents, 8 reported crimes, 3 detected crimes (involving a detected person) 2 incidences of vandalising, 1 theft of a car, 1 theft of fuel from a truck, and 1 assault. Also during routine transport checks a tachograph crime was detected. A member of the public brought concerns over recent thefts from local farms in November, involving chain saws and quad bikes asking why when a bike was recovered it was not staked out to establish if anyone came back for it.  Constable Sneddon reported that extra supervision would be given. Cllr Graeme Campbell informed the meeting that on the 20 <sup>th</sup> January at 12.30 there is a crime team meeting at the rural centre in Strathaven to offer advice on crimes at farms. One to one chats would be available with the police on this day.  A member of the public raised concerns over parties being held at the lifestyles centre and possible underage drinking. The parties regularly spill out into the surrounding community annoying residents; some parties have up to 180 people. Constable Sneddon will contact the licensing department to look into under age drinking and people leaving with alcohol. G Smith will contact the manager of the centre to look at ways to manage people exiting the centre. Cllr Graeme stated each offence should be logged with the police.  A member of the public stated their car had been vandalised with a key, the constable spoke to him privately to take statement.
