# **Churchyard Policy**

(Based on the the Diocesan Guidelines)

St Mary's Parochial Church Council (PCC) agrees the following:

#### **Burials:**

- 1. Every parishioner who is resident within the parish, those on the electoral roll, any person who dies in the parish has a right to be buried in the Churchyard;
- 2. No reservation of a space will be allowed unless a faculty has been granted by the Diocesan Chancellor;
- 3. Graves and plots for cremated remains to be double depth where a partner survives.
- 4. Type, size and material of headstone, plaque must comply with the Diocesan; Chancellor's guidelines, and submitted to the incumbent for approval or the Area Dean in times of vacancy;
- 5. Cremated remains must be in a perishable container and bio-degradable;
- 6. Scattering of ashes is not permitted under any circumstances.

## <u>Trees</u>

- 1. Condition of trees is the responsibility of PCC;
- 2. Maintenace and safety of the trees is the responsibility of the Churchwardens;
- 3. Planting of additional trees at discretion of incumbent and PCC, and faculty obtained for additional trees.

#### Flowers, etc.:

- 1. Fresh flowers are permitted, at head of grave, otherwise grass for ease of mowing. No permanent planting outside of agreed areas.
- 2. Christmas wreaths etc removed after two months
- 3. Artificial flowers, ornaments, other extras are to be discouraged (particularly if they are not biodegradable) and deteriorate in appearance. To be removed after a short period of time by the graveyard maintence group.

### Maintenance:

- 1. Grass- cutting will be carried out by an external contractor
- 2. Maintenance Group volunteers to ensure graveyard is kept appropriately with due respect for deceased parishioners.
- 3. Eco Church Group volunteers to ensure wild life areas are appropriately maintained and fostered.

This policy to be reviewed annually by the PCC following the APCM.
