Teams continue to promote handbell ringing in a variety of venues across Scotland – country markets & fairs; guilds and fellowship groups; nursing homes and hospitals - to mention but a few. The Parish of Dunkeld HR rang in Innerpeffray Chapel and the Chapel Royal at Falkland Palace. Lysbeth Wilson, Dunblane Cathedral HR, rang solo handbells at the launch of the Prestonpans Tapestry which recounts the journey of Bonnie Prince Charlie from France to victory at Prestonpans in 1745. Jordanhill Parish Church HR celebrated 20 years of ringing with a concert with friends.

The annual Scottish Schools Ring this year brought young ringers together at Newton Primary School in Dunblane. This was the 11th annual Schools Ring but the first to make history as it was broadcast live over the Scottish schools secure intranet, GLOW. Thanks are due to Lysbeth and Malcolm Wilson for the interest and encouragement they show to our young ringers.

Scottish ringers have participated in events countrywide and worldwide. Eleven ringers attended the National Rally in Leicester leading and participating in workshops. Six ringers attended UK Bronze in Sutton which was again directed by Fred Gramann. Heather McLean of Dunkeld joined the Bells of the Cascades cruise to Alaska. Three members participated in 'Echoes for Peace', the 14th International Handbell Symposium in Osaka, Japan – returning with some fantastic memories and ringing friendships made around the world.

On your behalf, I would like to thank the members of the committee for their contribution to the smooth running of the Region and the planning of events.

Thank you for your friendship and support over the past 12 months. I look forward to a happy and successful year in 2011/12.



Border Bells

Border Bells was rooted from its very beginnings in the U3A. (University of the Third Age for retired people and those who work part time). Its inspiration came from a brief note in a U3A magazine about the Flintinnabulas, a group in Flintshire who played Belleplates. This was followed up and the leader of that group was a mine of information and support .An encounter with handbells while on Shetland sparked my interest and led eventually to the purchase of the Belleplates.

We won an Awards for All grant which paid for the Belleplates, some equipment and music. Our two-octave set of Belleplates arrived in August 2007 to which we have now added A6. Five still remain of our original eight founding members and four more have joined us. Ruchi, a young Indian woman joined us for two or three months and made up beautiful deep red cloths for our tables. We each have a red scarf and wear white tops and dark trousers so if you see us at a rally you'll know who we are.

At first we played from a colourcoded grid but after seven or so months we changed to staff notation which immediately widened our horizons. Isa and Margaret started out with no music reading skills at all and are quite startled when we assure them that they are actually reading music.

Maureen is a retired teacher and keeps us on our toes with remembering to damp. Shirley and Margaret both come from a medical background. Marette is our efficient facilitator and the best quaver player of the group. while Sue writes lively music for us at useful moments.



Bridget is a new member having joined us a year ago. She was so keen to join us that she forgot to join U3A as well. Fortunately she is retired so eligible for our team.

In January we acquired a new member so we now have three Margarets. New Margaret slotted in very well and thoroughly enjoys bellringing with us.

Our progress has been encouraging but we could always do with more

Our two-octave set of Belleplates arrived in August 2007 members. One or two of us may try two-in-the-hand this year which would be a useful skill.

Our very first public appearance was at a local residential home at Christmas and looking back I am aware how unambitious it was. The Parish of Dunkeld HR

After flying home on a Saturday evening at the end of UK Bronze, it was off to Pitlochry early the next morning, having loaded the car a week earlier, with equipment for the group's usual performance at Dougie MacLean's Amber Festival - a great day, as always, with an enthusiastic audience. November saw members ringing for two hours in Pitlochry High Street at the start of Pitlochry Festival. The ringers were one of the many groups of musicians spread at intervals along the whole length of the street. Very cold but very enjoyable.

Early in December, another annual event is Santa's Day in Dunkeld, with reindeer pulling Santa on his sleigh from Birnam into Dunkeld. It's always fantastic and was listed this year by The Scottish Field as one of the top ten Christmas events in Scotland. We rang at The Cross (i.e. the square) in the morning and took part in the Carol Service held in The Cathedral in the afternoon.

The group provided entertainment for a Guild Christmas Party in Crieff and also at a Day Centre in Perth, which the ringers visit at regular intervals – both of these were great afternoons with everyone joining in the carols and singing their hearts out. Christmas activities ended on Christmas Eve with solo ringing in the Cathedral at the Watch Night Service. As you may imagine we were delighted to receive such a generous gift from Linda. On our tour this year we shall be performing in Oban, then crossing by ferry to Mull where we ring in Tobermory Church and also in Duart Castle (home of the chief of Clan



McLean). Then we cross to Iona for a return visit to ring in Iona Abbey. As you can imagine, everyone is looking forward to the trip – ferries, accommodation, venues etc. all booked a long while ago.
