Because of the Covid-19 pandemic, the committee decided to hold the 2021 Autumn Rally online. Ringers from the length and breadth of Scotland joined in a very successful event hosted by Caithness Handbell Ringers, enhanced by live handbell ringing and Katrina Gordon's expert guidance and musicianship. The event gave all those present a huge amount of encouragement as we recover from the pandemic.

It was another opportunity to experience a range of different activities such as some new ringing techniques, a quiz, lots of chat and virtual massed ringing for which Katrina chose *Prelude on Bunessan* by Lysbeth Wilson and *Alleluia* by Josie Willmer.

A number of ringers continue to meet in person. Indeed, my own team Holy Trinity Handbells made three appearances over the Christmas period. But with continued caution being advised by the Scottish government, face-to-face ringing may well be curtailed for the time being.

The Scottish Region AGM will be held via Zoom on Saturday 19 March 2022 at 1.30pm, and an inperson "Read and Ring" event is planned for 21st May in Bankfoot.

The committee is also busy preparing for the 2023 UK National Rally due to be held at the Stirling Court Hotel, Stirling from 14-16 April 2023.

What a delight it was to start back in person ringing in September 2021! Following a risk assessment for the church and for ringing it was felt we were safe to resume. We limited our numbers initially and rang from music stands. As restrictions eased we set the tables up in a different format to enable social distancing.

We have not had many engagements. However we were delighted that our first engagement in 20 months was for our own church guild. We also rang for a guild Christmas party.

We were delighted to ring the Hal Hopson piece 'Prepare the Way of the Lord' with the Jordanhill Community choir for the service of Lessons and Carols.

We had three engagements in February and are looking forward to in person ringing in May at the Bankfoot Church Centre. Fingers crossed that can still go ahead!

Putting on a concert when restrictions made it seem well-nigh impossible

At a time when pandemic restrictions were in place making planning a concert seem nearly impossible, Dunblane Cathedral Handbell Ensembles managed to present a successful concert at Christmas time with measures put in place to follow all advised safety mitigations.



All rehearsals leading up to the concert also had mitigations in place - including using a much bigger hall to provide space for social distancing between each ringer, handbells only handled by each ringer whose notes they were (each taking them home each week and bringing to each rehearsal), no shared equipment or music, one-way system in the hall, doors open at all times to create continuous flow of air (it was cold so ringers wrapped up warm!), masks for all, and hand sanitisation entering and leaving the hall. Music was made available digitally for ringers, along with audio recordings, so that in the event any rehearsal had to be cancelled or individual ringers had to miss rehearsals then they could practise their parts at home. Then, in planning for the concert, the audience numbers were restricted so that seating could be spaced out. An online ticket booking system was set up to cut down on handling cash, and a facility set up for accepting cashless payments on the night of the concert. And after all of that, and the risk that even at the last minute the whole concert could be cancelled, we were delighted to be able top present a concert of Christmas music to an appreciative audience. We had gained 8 new ringers since the outbreak of the pandemic and so it was really great the new ringers had their very first successful performance in the concert. And also one of our high school ringers presented two solo pieces on Belleplates to the delight of the audience. We also had two pieces in which all groups performed together, along with other instrumentalists. And to add to the fun for the evening we had the audience join in with different pieces adding jingling percussion or clapping and stamping on cue. We also made available online on our YouTube channel some of the recordings from that concert so you too can enjoy a flavour of the concert. Here's to the next concert - hope we can see you there!
