Llangollen 06 April 2014

Today we have two rather full coaches for our trip to Denbighshire in North Wales with the meeting point at Lymm services on the M6. It's quite a way and will take time to get there but we've done it before and had a good day somewhere a bit different.



We're far better in making the morning stop as quick as possible; this is much appreciated and really does help the rest of the day go smoother. [BTW: that's also a hint for today]. I also appreciate people helping out by moving to another coach which has allowed even more of us to come. Fingers crossed a 57 seat coach can get over the horse-shoe pass though!

Today's Walks

A Walk Robert Eccles

Off first at Pen-y-stryt

121/2 miles Moderate

Starting from Pen-y-stryt we pick-up The Clwydian Way to Graig Farm where we leave it to start our journey over Cyrny-Brain to Worlds End. Here we pick-up the alternative Offer's Dyke path to follow the limestone ridge to Trevor Rocks via Craig y Cythraul and Craig Arthur. If time and weather permit we may make a detour to the trig point on Ruabon Mountain for the views over the Cheshire Plain. From Trevor Rocks it's a short but steep drop drown to the road before we're up and over Crow Castle to Llangolen.

Over-all, one of the best higher-level walks in the area with 670m of ascent.

B Walk Michael Counter

Off second at Llangollen

91/2 miles Moderate

This walk is to the south of the town. Llangollen, North Berwyn Way, Vivod Mountain, T Foel, Biddulf Tower, LLwybr Ceiroi g Trail, Ty n Celin, Pen y Coed, Llangollen. The views from the tops are truly spectacular. These include looking across the Dee valley to the fortress of Dinas Bran and the Eglwyseg Mountains behind; the whole of the Ceiriog valley, Cadair Berwyn and even a glimpse of Snowdon in the far distance.

C Walk Paul Brown

Off second at Llangollen

8 miles Moderate

We leave the coaches in Llangollen, cross the River Dee on the road bridge, then walk steadily uphill northwards towards Castell Dinas Bran (ruins of a 13th century castle). We climb steeply up to the castle along a good zig zag path; views from the top are worth the effort. We then descend walking eastwards to join the Offa's Dyke Path, which we follow for about 2 miles to Trevor Hall Woods. We then cross the A539 road, walk on field paths, the disused railway and country lanes to reach the Llangollen branch of the Shropshire Union Canal, which we follow westwards along the towpath back to Llangollen.

If the day is clear there are also good views from Offa's Dyke across the Vale of Llangollen.

D Walk Sue Baxendale

Off second at Llangollen

6 miles Moderate

From coaches walk through the town to canal and then along the tow path for just over 2 miles, passing Horseshoe Falls, to Llantysilio church. Lunch here with time to visit the church. Then take minor road and then steps to meet the path around the side of Velvet Hill. This is the hardest section of the walk, the path is good surface but narrow and undulating. Then drop down to Valle Crucis Abbey, through the caravan park to cross the stream and up another flight of steps. From here the wide track takes us through the woods along the lower hillside to join the road at Byn Hyfryd. Then minor road to either rejoin field paths back to Llangollen, one last gentle climb to base of Castell Dinas Bran, or stay on minor road back into the town.

This is not the easiest of D walks but the views are well worth the effort.

New Way to Book for the Next Trips

I'm doing the courier's job for the first time this trip and as a direct consequence I finally modified the coach program to make the job easier. A classic case of doing nothing until it affects oneself!

When the booking forms are passed around you'll notice that your name is already listed under those that have pre-booked. (Before today it was just blank lines). Thus:

To book:

- Find you name in the list (it's ordered by surname)

- Check that your pick-up-point is correct; if not write over it
- Put a tick in the paying by cheque or cash box

To not book:

To book for someone not on today's trip:

- Go to the end of the list where there are some empty lines
- Fill the details in as hitherto

For most people booking should now just be a couple of ticks and putting a cheque in the pouch.
