Today we have just the one main coach for our trip to Denbigshire and the Clwydian AONB. The Blackburn and Burnley coaches will rendezvous at Darwen Services with the morning stop at Chester Services.



Today's Walks

B Walk Robert Eccles Off First 11 miles Strenuous

Starting from Loggerheads we pick-up the Clwydian Way south towards Maeshafn before turning west to Llanferres. Now it's across fields and through plantations to reach Offa's Dyke Path where we start our main climb of the day. Skirting the fort Foel Fenlli (some can avoid the skirt and head up and over if they fancy) we reach the view point at Bwich Penbarra. Continuing north (and up) we reach the highest point in the Bryniau Clwyd at Moel Famau (554m); on a clear day this is a fantastic view point. Eventually branching off Offa's Dyke Path we skirt the range to Teiran before field paths and tracks to Ruthin.

A lovely walk that takes in the woodland, hills and valleys of the area; mainly on good paths and with plenty of time to complete the walk at a steady pace. 11 miles with 650m of ascent over the whole walk.

C Walk Paul Brown Off Second 7 miles Moderate

We leave the coaches at Llanferres and climb steadily away from the village, then join a bridleway which takes us southwestwards to reach the long distance path Offa's Dyke. We follow Offa's Dyke to below Foel Fenlli, then continue around the hill to reach the col at Bwich Penbarra. From here we descend on tracks, lanes, and field paths to the village of Lllanber-Dyffryn-Clwyd, then continue along more field paths, coming into Ruthin through the grounds of Ruthin School.

A few higher bar stiles to cross, and overall about 180 metres of climbing on this walk. However, the views of the Vale of Clwyd from Offa's Dyke are really special, and well worth the effort.

D Walk Roger Haythornthwaite Off Third 6½ miles Fairly Easy

Alight at Ruthin Coach Park. Proceed to the River Clwyd and take the riverside path to Plas-y-Ward Farm and field paths and lanes to Rhewl. Walk along Lady Bagot's Drive, a gently-rising path up a rather attractive gorge by the River Afon Clywedog. Cross a footbridge over the river and climb out of the valley to Hengoed. Follow downhill and level lanes past Court Farm, through Galltegfa and finally a longish stretch back into Ruthin.

Fairly easy except for one steep climb out of a valley

E Walk No Leader Off Third 1½ miles Easy

A suggestion from Paul: Starting from the coach park in Ruthin; a 1.5mile town trail that includes the Craft Centre, the pleasant Cae Ddôl park (good for a lunch stop), Ruthin Gaol, St Peter's Church, and other places of interest. Map and guides are available free in the Craft Centre.
