Moderate

11.5 miles

From Grassington we head north to the farmstead of Yarnbury (1200ft). Then east to pass old lead mine workings and follow the brook into the village of Hebden. We then travel along field paths and lanes to the village of Burnsall and the picturesque Burnsall Bridge. The route now follows the River Wharf, along parts of the Dales Way to the "Hidden Village" of Thorpe. On to Litton before climbing up onto Threshfield Moor (1100ft) and down to Skirethorns and on into Threshfield. Finally the field paths take us back into Grassington. This walk does not involve any rock climbing as at Hathersage!!

B Walk Leader Paul Brown

Moderate

9 miles

Starting from Rylstone we walk to Hetton then follow a good track northwards for about 1½ miles bringing us above Winterburn Reservoir. We then continue northwards, cross Boss Moor Lane and Boss Moor, then walk eastwards crossing Threshfield Moor to reach Skirethorns. After crossing the B6265 road, and then the former Grassington railway (closed 1930) on a stone arch footbridge, we walk to the lovely village of Linton and then on to Linton Church. We cross the River Wharfe by footbridge at Linton Falls then join Sedber Lane to walk uphill to reach the car/coach park at the Yorkshire Dales National Park visitor centre. Some interesting things to see along the route and hopefully good views of Upper Wharfedale. Please note the moorland crossings are wet and muddy.

C Walk **Barbara Sharples**

Moderate/Strenuous with a few easy stiles

From Grassington we walk through the village and along an ancient track up to the moors via the Dales Way towards Kettlewell. Stunning views open up all around us. We then descend to the village of Conistone, for lunch, but not before negotiating a short, rocky scramble down in to a gorge. Turning left we have a short stretch along a minor road to enter Grass Wood and then Lower Grass Wood. We then follow the River Wharf to Linton Falls passing Ghaistrill's Strid and then back up to the coach park.

D Walk

From coach park walk through Grassington to the top of the village and take High Lane to Hebden. We go down Hebden Gill to cross the River Wharf at the suspension bridge. Then ascend the Postman's Steps and on to the lovely villages of Thorpe and Linton. Back down to the weir and take the riverbank path back into Grassington.

Pick up time for return journey. 5.00 pm from the coach park. Please do not ask the driver for extra stops on the way home as this can be dangerous and make the return journey longer for everyone.
