

# Hawkshead 02 April 2023

Today we are travelling to Hawkshead in the Lake District. Hawkshead is a truly historic and wonderfully picturesque village characterised by its cluster of whitewashed houses, archways and alleyways, courtyards and squares.

# Today's Walks:

#### A/B Walk Tony Culverhouse

## 9.5 miles moderate/strenuous

We set off North out of Hawkshead to climb steeply to the top of Latterbarrow, giving us panoramic views of Coniston, Langdale and the Howgill Fells. We then head south along forestry tracks, passing Moss Eccles Tarn, to Far Sawrey. We loop north to follow the shoreline of Windermere to Bass Rock where we climb inland. A quite stony and muddy forestry track descends to Colthouse and on to Hawkshead

Spectacular views and scenic vistas (it <u>is</u> the Lake District!) Some quite steep sections. Some muddy spots.

## C/D Walk Jane Cordingley 6.5 miles easy with a couple of short uphill sections

From the coach park we head out on well-made paths and field tracks to Birkwray Farm. From there we pass through High Tock How to take the north side of Bletham Tarn, with far reaching views of the Lakeland fells, to arrive at Low Wray and on to Wray Castle. Following the shore path for a short while, we then head back towards Hawkshead via gently undulating field paths (muddy) to rejoin our outgoing path, Scar House Lane, again enjoying superb views of the surrounding hills. Hopefully returning to Hawkshead with time to explore the village, visit a pub or take the 0.5-mile extra walk to Colthouse on the east of Hawkshead to visit one of the oldest Quaker Meeting Houses in Cumbria.

2 short road sections, 4 stiles. Total ascent: 570 feet
