COACH TRAVEL - you need to wear a mask when boarding and leaving the coach and standing in the aisle but once sat in your seat (with the seat belt fastened which is a legal requirement) you may remove your mask!

Do I still have to wear a mask in Wales?

Unlike in England, the requirement to wear a mask is not ending in Wales, although it is being changed.

As of 7 August, masks will remain mandatory on public transport, shops and other indoor public areas.

The exception to this rule is in pubs, restaurants and schools and social distancing laws will go.



5th September - Llandudno

Bookings Now being taken.

Llandudno is a coastal town in north Wales. It's known for North Shore Beach and 19th-century Llandudno Pier, with shops and a games arcade. Northwest of town, the cliffs of Great Orme headland jut into the sea.

On this trip there will be a B walk to the Little Orme and surrounding area.

The C & D walkers will explore the Great Orme, The Summit Trail, the Historic Trail or the Nature Trail.

Non-walkers can take the Great Orme Tramway to the summit. Visitor information and costs

These walks offer spectacular **views** of Liverpool Bay, the Carneddau range, the Menai Strait and Anglesey.

The Great Orme consists of mainly limestone grassland, with heathland, limestone pavement, scrub, woodland and sea cliffs. It is of importance for its landscape, wildlife, geology and its history.

3rd October - Arnside/Silverdale

This extraordinary place is famous for its amazing wildlife, stunning scenery, and superb walks.

We hope to have a guest leader for an A walk of 12-14 miles. The distance is subject to weather and terrain conditions on the day. ***You need to book on to the 'A' walk when making your coach booking please.*** Bookings taken from 9.00am on Sunday, 5th September.



From the simple beauty of the lady's-slipper orchid to the shining sands of Morecambe Bay, the area is simply awe-inspiring.

Stunning limestone pavements, ancient woodlands, intimate orchards and meadows and an impressive coastline make Arnside & Silverdale an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty one of England's finest landscapes.

7th November - Pateley Bridge, Nidderdale

Pateley Bridge is full of tranquil charm as it nestles in the heart of Nidderdale, an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. This quaint market town in Nidderdale is a great base for exploring the surrounding countryside and the Yorkshire Dales.



The peace of this beautiful area has provided inspiration for writers and artists alike, and kept many a visitor returning year after year to enjoy the serenity.



There are lots of short walks for those wanting something shorter than our 'D' walk. The Curlew Trail, Pateley Bridge Heritage Trails, Victorian Gardens of Pateley Bridge Trail and Scot Gate Ash Trail.



5th December - Festive Walk - Knaresborough

The exact origins of this market town of ancient walkways, cobbled alleys and secret passageways are shrouded in mystery. But one thing's for sure, Knaresborough has carved out a real character for itself with a Tudor prophets, once royal castle, magnificent viaduct and breathtaking countryside views. ***On this trip we will also enjoy the Christmas Market and firework display.*** More information [HERE](#).
