Eleven Ramblers met at Pool o' Muckhart last Sunday for an 8-mile circular walk to Rumbling Bridge. This is a favourite walk with our group and your correspondent was pleased to remember at least some of the route from almost three years ago. We set out along paths and fields towards the picturesque Muckhart Mill and, having made our way up the incline beyond the Mill, we were glad to stop for the first of the two lunch breaks promised by our leader. We continued towards Rumbling Bridge, where the River Devon was rumbling much more

gently than on our last visit. Nevertheless we spent some time at the scenic viewpoints in the gorge before resuming our journey along the riverbank towards our second lunch stop, at a well-chosen, tranquil spot beside the river. As we returned along minor roads and paths towards our starting point, we enjoyed a brief glimpse of a red squirrel darting about in the trees above us. Back in Pool o' Muckhart, several of us made a beeline for refreshments at the local café (another Ramblers' favourite) thus completing a fine day out.



Our next walk is on Saturday 8th October, 8.5-miles from Drumoig to Morton Lochs. This is a moderate, circular walk on paths through farmland and woodland, with some minor road walking. It offers fine panoramic views and wildlife to spot at Morton Lochs.
