St Andrews and North East Fife Ramblers stayed local at the end of last month with a 9-mile figure-of-eight walk around the Tayport area. Seven of us set out from the Larrick Centre on the first circuit, taking the coastal path towards the harbour and along the edge of the Tay. We admired the former lighthouses before crossing the main road and making our way uphill into Scotsraig Wood. After following tracks leading through the wood and downhill again, we now



headed back to the Larrick Centre where two more walkers joined us for the second circuit. Our next destination was Morton Lochs in Tentsmuir Forest, via Scotsraig golf course and Garpit. We stopped for lunch beside the first hide at the lochs, where we were delighted to catch a glimpse

of three red squirrels scampering high up in the trees. Continuing past the second hide we observed the devastation swathes of fallen trees have Fetterdale we followed the forest which took us back to the Larrick Centre once café and its friendly staff for and thankfully largely rain-
