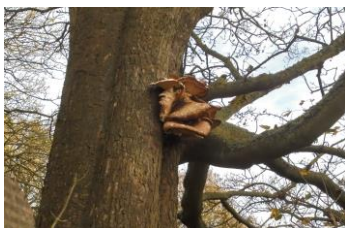


The Ramblers - St Andrews & N.E. Fife Group
