Good afternoon,

Thank you for your email. We appreciate your engagement with the consultation on Scottish electricity consenting. The objective of the proposed reforms is to remove inefficiencies in the Electricity Act 1989, whilst giving communities and statutory consultees meaningful opportunities to influence applications for consent. The responses of community members and councils local to existing or proposed electricity infrastructure are therefore important in informing policy.

UK and Scottish Ministers agree that reforms to electricity infrastructure consenting in Scotland need to be progressed at pace and that Government should legislate as soon as Parliamentary time allows. Although the deadline for responses to the consultation is 29 November, responses can be submitted beyond this date. We will endeavour to include these in our evidence base and analysis where possible.
