St Newlyn East Pit is a place of cultural and historical interest to the Parish and is run by a Management Committee. The Pit was created from a former quarry by local preacher and quarryman, John Andrew, in 1852 as a memorial to the 39 miners who lost their lives in the 1846 flood at the East Wheal Rose Mine. The Pit is a Grade II Listed structure and is available for concerts, shows, plays etc.
