Chilton Mutual Aid

After a lot of consideration we wanted to let you all know that we have made the decision to close down the CMA group. We believe that CMA was of great value to many of those in the community; however, as life slowly returns to a new kind of normal, we feel that now is the right time to say goodbye. As part of this process we will be deleting the data we are

currently holding for group volunteers as per GDPR. Thanks to the kind generosity of so many of you, we have surplus CMA funds which will be donated locally for the benefit of those groups most impacted by COVID. Funds will be donated to the Chilton Toddler Group and the Lunch Club; the school will also receive a donation that will be ring fenced for children of families who may need support to pay for extracurricular activities including school trips. Water Carry On!

You may be aware that sewer blockages in Main Street are a fairly regular occurrence. During May there were blockages on the 7th and 25th of the month.

After the most recent blockage we had a message from Thames Water:

"We visited today to clear a blockage, however, we were not able to find the cause. To get to the bottom of this, the engineer has referred the investigation to a technical specialist to review. We aim to be in touch with you within 48 hours to advise of next steps."

"Bottom" being the operative word, no doubt!

Some of you might have received a letter from Thames Water dated 22 June, to advise work would be carried out on 29 June to clean and survey the sewer in Main Street, Crafts End and Church Hill. The camera survey showed scale in the sewer line which will require a high-pressure water jet to clean it.

The village's sewer is only 150mm diameter, installed in an earlier era when there were about 70 houses. Blockages are caused by wet wipes and cotton pads, cooking fats and oils, sanitary items and nappies. These should be disposed in the grey bins, or food waste caddies, not poured or flushed down the drains.

<u>D-Day Service At The RAF Harwell</u> Memorial Stone 5th June 2021

The annual D-Day Service held at the Harwell Stone recognised the 77th Anniversary of

D-Day. It was a far reduced event, but no less poignant an affair.

Following the cancellation of the 2020 Service due to the increase spread of the Covid19 pandemic, Harwell Branch were keen to acknowledge the 2021 anniversary after

hearing the Government's roadmap out of lockdown permitted some form of gathering.

The roadmap indicated that for 5th June, gatherings outside would be permitted with a

limitation set at a maximum of 30. The branch considered this number and didn't feel it

would be neither practical or fair to plan for this number given the large numbers who

attend each year. Instead a smaller format based on the minimum attendance was

considered and concluded that a suitable service could be completed with 12 persons present.

The service was conducted by Rev Pam Rolls, and attended by invited representatives

to lay wreaths, standards of the Royal British Legion, a bugler and camera operator to coordinate the

live streaming allowing those who couldn't attend to feel part of the service. The Recording

A 2 minutes silence was observed following the last post played by Jamie Cockburn which was followed by the laying of the wreaths.

These were laid by the Wantage Mayor and Chilton Parish Council on behalf of Civic

authorities, by the RBL County Chairman, Harwell Branch President, RAFA and Glider

Pilots Regiment Society on behalf of the veterans associations and a Director of Harwell

Oxford Campus, on behalf of all the businesses and organisations on site.

The inscription on the stone reads:

"This Stone Marks The End Of The Runway From Which Aircraft Of No.38 Group Royal Air Force Took Off On The Night Of 5 June 1944 With Troops Of The 6th Airborne Division Who Were Among The First British Soldiers To Land In Normandy On The Main Assault For The Liberation Of Europe"

Harwell Branch thanks those who participated and to those who cooperated with

the restrictions in place.
