<u>Chilton Neighbourhood Plan –</u> <u>Referendum 9 September</u>

We are now approaching the final stage in preparing a Neighbourhood Development Plan for Chilton – a referendum to either accept it or reject it.

Neighbourhood Planning is a way for communities to develop a shared vision and have a say in the future of the places where they live and work. It gives communities the power to produce a plan with real legal weight that directs development in your local area. It helps the Parish and District Council:

- choose where you want new homes, shops and offices to be built
- have your say on what those new buildings should look like
- grant planning permission for the new buildings you want to see go ahead

Chilton Parish Council formed a Steering Group of volunteer residents to produce a neighbourhood plan for Chilton.

The plan has been prepared by a rigorous process which has included a survey to capture the views of residents, two public consultations, an independent examination, and support from the Vale of White Horse District Council.

This plan is now the subject of a referendum on **Thursday September 9**th. Further details are given on the accompanying flyer provided by the Vale of White Horse District Council. You must be on the Electoral Register to vote.

If the Neighbourhood Plan is adopted it becomes entrenched in the planning policy for Chilton, sitting alongside the local plan developed by the District Council, with all future planning applications being assessed against its policies.

The policies developed within the neighbourhood plan for Chilton address planning matters relating to the following:

- Location of Development
- Design Styles for Developments
- The Historic Environment
- Sustainable Business Development
- Natural Environment Flora and Fauna
- Mitigation of Traffic Noise
- Avoidance of unnecessary light pollution
- Community Infrastructure
- Local Green Spaces
