Bus News

TIMETABLE CHANGES

Thames Travel has announced some changes to timetables of buses serving east Oxford, due to traffic congestion in the St Clement's area. We have checked the timetable for the X32 and cannot see any changes to this route's times through Chilton. However, the City34s which run from Chilton to Wantage in the mornings are altered: the 0748 from Main Street will leave at 0737, and the 0826 from Main Street with leave at 0839.

These changes apply from 8 January. We have <u>attached</u> <u>a summary timetable</u> from Chilton to this copy of the Chronicle.

FARES CAPPED AT £2

For an initial period of three months from 1 January 2023, the government is funding a cap of £2 on all adult single bus tickets for local journeys.

The single adult fare from Chilton to Oxford is currently £3.80, so you can get there for nearly half price. The X32 bus from Chilton at 0913 on Mondays to Fridays will take you straight there, and there are many more buses from stops on Harwell Campus.
