## **Chairman's Annual Report**

Council Elections will be held on May 4<sup>th</sup> so you may be reading this after the event. All Chilton Parish Council seats were up for election. However as there were less candidates than available seats there was no election for Chilton Parish. Two of the current Councillors have decided not to stand for re-election.

Dr Stephen Druce has served on the Parish Council for 8 years making a significant contribution over the years. His most important work was leading the group that successfully wrote the Neighbourhood Plan which is now part of the planning process. The analysis and insight he applied to issues was invaluable.

Lucy Amstead has unfortunately decided that due to other commitments she is not able to stand for reelection. Lucy often brought a different and valuable perspective to our discussions and she will be missed.

Following delays largely due to the pandemic the latest Play Area Project got under way and is run by an effective and enthusiastic team of volunteers. The Consultations they organised have resulted in a final design which has been publicised. Some further work is required before the Vale of White Horse will release the money and construction can start.

Evaluation of Planning Applications continues to form a significant part of the Council's work. It is particularly satisfying to note the part played by the Chilton Neighbourhood Plan in assessing the compliance of applications with policy. Applications for significant developments outside the Development Boundaries defined in the Neighbourhood Plan have been refused.

An application that took up a great deal of Council time was for what is now known as the Moderna Buildings, a vaccine production facility situated within Chilton Parish on the Harwell Campus. This application is outside the area covered by the Neighbourhood Plan and is in an Enterprise Zone which was basically set up to facilitate this type of development where Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty policies do not apply.

However, the Council was concerned about the loss of playing fields, the impact on historic RAF artefacts and disruption during construction. The Council held several public meetings to discuss this application and also meetings with the applicant for more information and to clarify points.

Eventually mediation for the loss of playing fields was agreed with Sport England. Historic England and the County Archaeologist agreed the classification of the RAF artefacts including the preservation and integration of some parts of the Catapult Pit into the development. Given the endorsement of these parts of the Application by National Authorities the Parish Council did not object to these aspects of the Application. However, late in the assessment process traffic modelling data was released which showed an increase in queuing traffic coming off Hagbourne Hill potentially hampering ingress and egress from the Village for cars and buses. Some mitigation was proposed to reduce the possibility of traffic queuing on the Northbound A34 slip, however this does not consider Chilton Village. A major concern is that future developments known to be planned at the Campus will significantly aggravate the situation with no overall plan to deal with traffic affecting Chilton. So, the Council objected and sought assurances that Chilton would be involved in future traffic plans and workable mitigation measures introduced if the objection was to be withdrawn. In the event the Vale of White Horse felt they were unable to give appropriate assurances, so the Application went to the Planning Committee who unanimously approved it. However, the Campus did give good assurances on future applications and I am confident that our issues will be recognised and dealt with appropriately in future.

You will have noted that the old part of the Village now has a 20mph speed limit. Oxfordshire County Council encouraged villages to apply for the new limit and following a consultation with residents Chilton was successful. Chilton Field is already scheduled for a 20mph limit BUT this cannot be implemented until the roads are adopted. Land registration issues continue to delay adoption.

Finally, I would like to thank all Councillors for the valuable voluntary work they have done over the last year on behalf of Chilton residents.

# <u>Village Hall Management Committee</u> Annual Report 2022

The Village Hall and Community Room continue to maintain a healthy list of regular hirer groups. Groups cover a diversity of interests from Chilton baby and toddlers' group, Yoga and Zumba classes to child minder venue.

The VHMC will review the Hirer rates for both venues at the May 2023 AGM. It has been previously proposed that rates will continue as they are with the only changes being that of the wedding party package deposit from £50 to a higher amount.

Unfortunately, the VHMC lost several of its members from the 2022 AGM and after who have been truly missed. This includes Sharon Scott, Alex Capp and Sue Granger. All these members put many years and hard work into both venues, and we very much thank them for everything they did. We will also be losing John Berry this year, our rep from the PC. We also want to thank him for his time and dedication.

We did however have Debra Dewhurst and Margaret McGoey join our committee. Margaret helps with

general maintenance within the Village Hall as well as carries out essential Health and Safety checks. Debra took the Secretary position. She has also taken over the role of booking manager temporarily and in the short time she has been doing this she has updated the bookings system, and this so far is working very well. It has reduced the large amount of time it takes for booking to be completed and we have had some very positive feedback from both regular and casual hirers. Both Margaret and Debra have become valued members of the committee.

Bookings are very wholesome at both the Community room and the Village Hall, and the calendar is looking robust for the near future.

Reserves continue to be healthy, due to high numbers of bookings.

There has been a high amount maintenance needed this year. Most of which due to general wear and tear. The Community room has had both sets of doors replaced and seen a fresh covering of paint. The Village Hall is still in need of redecoration and the committee has been looking into upgrading several areas to both improve the property as well and fixing required areas. This included Solar panels, LED lighting and Infrared heating. An energy efficiency review is being sort out. Additional funding by way of Sec 106 funding from the completion of Pegasus Close is going towards creating a social patio area at the back of the Village Hall. A consultation has been started for this, although on hold due to resources.

The next 12 months are looking very positive for both venues despite having a small number on the VHMC. Recruitment will remain a priority.

Finally, I would like to thank all the Village Hall Committee members for their dedication, time and efforts over the past twelve months. Without these volunteers, we would not have either of the venues available to our community.
