



# A reflection from John and Carol Pigott

The other day, a member of our Home Group asked how long we had lived in Chilton. Since 1977. More than half our lives!

I remember trudging through the mud, taking the children to school, across the construction site that was to be the new A34. Having braved the mud, it was the traffic on the old road (now the track down and under the A34) that had to be braved, with lollipop man Charlie Shaw, school caretaker, taking his life in his hands for our safety.

Those days, there was no village hall, either. Just an old church hall, made of wood, opposite Crafts End, at the foot of Churchill. It was used for Sunday School, Girls' Brigade, and any other functions of the church or village. That was "normality" in those days.

Fast forward, and we have just had our "normality" overturned drastically by the pandemic; and then again, life has taken another lurch, with the sad passing of Queen Elizabeth. What will the new era of King Charles bring with it, we wonder?

In church life, we are just coming out of a year's "Interregnum", as well. This is the time "in-between" one Rector and another. We have been blessed to have had a hard-working team (from both parishes) to lead us through it and we will now be moving forward with our new Rector, Jeremy Parsons.

Traditionally, Christian's regard Pentecost/Whitsun as the "birthday of the church", when we remember the coming of the Holy Spirit, bringing the wind of change into our lives. You may, or may not, normally join us in our church services and events (everyone is always welcome) but may we all look forward to the coming changes in all our lives with courage and enthusiasm.
