Monthly Parish Update from
Vale of White Horse District Councillors
Cllr Hayleigh Gascoigne and Cllr Debra Dewhurst

Hello from Hayleigh and Debra

As we head towards Christmas, this will be our last update of the year. It has been a busy end to the year for us. This month the VWHDC has been finalising the 'preferred options' for our Joint Local Plan with South Oxfordshire District Council. The Joint Local Plan will guide the kinds of new housing and jobs needed and where they should go, informing planning application decisions for the districts. Consultation on the preferred options will open in the near year for residents and parish councils to comment on.

We know residents are very concerned about healthcare locally, as are we. This month Debra spoke at the Oxfordshire Joint Health Overview & Scrutiny Committee meeting to raise the issue of healthcare provision in and around the Didcot area. She also challenged Dan Leveson, the Place Director for the Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire and Berkshire West Integrated Care Board (BOB ICB) to give reassurances that the health centre planned for Great Western Park (GWP) will be built and asked him what is causing the delay. We are currently awaiting a response from Mr Leveson in writing and will share that when we have it. We also raised the issue of dangerous parking around Costa and the other shops on Greenwood Way on GWP, with Thames Valley Police (TVP). Cars are being parked on the pavements reducing visibility, which could lead to an accident, but the situation is made all the more complicated because the roads are yet to be adopted. Chief Constable Jason Hogg kindly suggested a meeting between TVP and Western Valley Parish Council to see how this issue can be tackled, which we hope to set up in the new year.

Whether you are celebrating Christmas or just taking a break, we wish you and your families an enjoyable and restful festive period. We hope that you can spend much-needed time with your loved ones, and we wish you happiness and good health for the new year ahead.

Cost of living help – The Community Hub will be closed from 4.30pm on Friday 22 December 2023 and will reopen on Tuesday 2 January 2024 at 8.30am. If you need support or advice over the festive period please go to our Cost of living help pages for more information or please contact our emergency out of hours phone number – 01235 422420.

Planning – Any planning applications or post submitted/received after 4.30pm on 22 December 2023, including electronic submissions, will be treated as having been received on our next working day, Tuesday 2 January 2024.

Council tax and benefits services – If anyone needs urgent help with council tax or benefits during the holidays, Capita's phone lines will be open as usual between 27 and 29 December.

Emergency Situations – There are details of what to do and who to contact during an emergency on our websites – **Emergency situations Vale**

Leisure Centres and Warm Spaces – over the Christmas period there will be changes to the opening times of our Better Leisure Centres, please check via the <u>Better UK website</u> or with staff at your local centre for details. Our Leisure Centres are also open as <u>Warm Spaces</u> this winter from 9am to 2pm Monday to Friday. Pop in and charge your phone, have a hot drink and chat with others.
