Monthly Parish Update from Vale of White Horse District Councillors Cllr Hayleigh Gascoigne and Cllr Debra Dewhurst Hello from Hayleigh and Debra

Happy New Year! January will be a busy month for the district council. You can now comment on the 'preferred options' of the Joint Local Plan (JLP) that the Vale of White Horse District Council have been working on together with South Oxfordshire District Council. The JLP will set out the kinds of new housing and jobs needed and where they should go. It will inform planning application decisions for the districts. It will also have policies to help address the climate emergency, restore nature and meet the needs of residents, such as delivering genuinely affordable low-carbon homes with the right infrastructure to go with it. The figure below shows where we are in the process of developing the JLP.



Now we need your input again. There are two ways to read the current version of the JLP (the preferred options) and make your comments: for a detailed look at the plan go to https://jlp.southandvale.gov.uk/ or for a briefer look go to "JLP in a Nutshell" at https://theconversation.southandvale.gov.uk/. Council News

December's Full Council Meeting

In its last full meeting of the year, Council debated significant points of interest to the District and its future, with a motion restating the Vale's opposition to the proposed reservoir, SESRO. It also considered the upcoming consultation to the Council's forthcoming joint local plan and its future commitment to climate action and nature recovery.

Highlights:

Motion opposing Thames Water's Proposed Reservoir: The first motion noted the Council's concerns around the Southeast Strategic Reservoir Option (SESRO) set out in the draft regional plan by Thames Water. The Council's resolutions included to request a meeting with the current Secretary of State alongside a call for the SESRO approval processes to be paused. Proposer Cllr Robert Clegg-; Seconder — Cllr Andy Cooke

Motion affirming the Council's Commitment to Nature Recovery: The second motion focussed on action on the crisis in nature and our commitment to nature recovery. The Council acknowledged the importance of biodiversity and nature and resolved to ensure both were given equal priority with climate change within planning policies and design guides and the new corporate plan. Proposer — Cllr Sarah James; Seconder — Cllr Katherine Foxhall

Unanimous approval of Chilton Parish Council's S106 Request: The Council unanimously approved a request for S106 funding for play area/recreation improvements, including accessible equipment for children of all abilities — this is a part of continual commitment of VWHDC to provide accessible equipment for play areas in the district.

Have your say on a new political map for the Vale of White Horse District Council

The Local Government Boundary Commission wants to hear what residents and organisations think about their local area. The Commission is the independent body that draws these boundaries. It is reviewing Vale of White Horse to make sure councillors represent about the same number of electors, and that ward arrangements help the council work effectively. It wants to be sure that its proposals reflect community ties and identities. Have your say here:

Greetings from St Matthew's Harwell and All Saints' Chilton!

January is often associated with new beginnings. Resolutions are made, people sign up to do dry January, abstaining from alcohol, or Veganuary where people commit to being vegan for a month, compelled by the environmental and health benefits. We find ourselves being asked if we've made any New Year's resolutions. People's responses are generally divided into two camps — those who make several, or those who are quite happy to make none. I find myself fitting into the latter. However, for me, there are new beginnings. Following an exploration period, I'm delighted to be licensed as Curate at Harwell and Chilton Churches. This means that I am a minister who is training to be a Vicar.

We had some wonderful services over Christmas where together we wondered and discovered afresh the Good News of Jesus coming to earth as a baby by tracing the journey of Mary and Joseph. At Christmas time, there can be a renewed sense of hope, even when Christmas might feel difficult for us concerning bereavement or other life circumstances. For many, January can also be a challenging month following on from the festivities, as financial pressures resurface, as we settle back into routines and as the weather remains dull.
