D Day Remembrance - 5th June

An evening of Remembrance held at the D Day Memorial Stone, Harwell Campus — Wednesday $\mathbf{5}^{th}$ June.

80 years after the very evening aircraft with allied troops took off from Harwell for D-Day, Harwell RBL is hosting a Festival of Remembrance to mark the 80th anniversary of that historic event.

The evening will include a historical retelling of what took place in the days leading up to 5th June 1944 at RAF Harwell, musical accompaniment from the Thames Valley Wing Band, and a 2 minutes silence and wreath laying. All are welcome to join us from 1900 for a 1930 start.

The D Day Service at the RAF Harwell Memorial Stone – Saturday 8th June

On the Saturday nearest to the anniversary of D-Day, an annual parade and service is held at the RAF Harwell Memorial Stone at the Harwell Oxford Campus. The stone marks the departure point for Servicemen who were amongst the first to land on D-Day.

We will be joining the nation by recognizing the 80th anniversary this year, with a commemorative service taking place on **Saturday 8th June**.

Persons can assemble at the stone from 5pm for the service starting at 1730 after. Legion, Service Standards and Cadet Forces Standard have marched on. Attendees should note there are no facilities at the Stone.
