## **Bus service changes**

### X24 and X34

The bus service has some alterations from Monday 2 September. A new X24 route replaces some of the X34 services. The X24s will give a faster service between Didcot Parkway railway station and Harwell Campus – to the Campus in the mornings from the Campus in the afternoons – by running via Milton Heights (avoiding Great Western Park and Harwell village). Those X24s which are extended to Newbury will also not serve Chilton village, although they will continue to serve the Chilton Garden Centre stops.

Between the Vodafone roundabout and Newbury, the X24s and X34s will be diverted to serve Donnington village, although this alteration will not start until Monday 9 September.

The new summary timetable for Chilton is attached to this edition of the Chronicle.

This service will only run on schooldays with one journey from Chilton at 0723 to Wantage, returning to Chilton at 1638 from Wantage Market Place.

#### ST1

The route in Oxford of the ST1 service between Harwell Campus and Oxford city centre has been altered because a weight limit has been imposed on Donnington Bridge. This means the ST1s will no longer serve the Redbridge Park & Ride. It does not affect the bus service times, but it will no longer be possible to change at Redbridge for buses to the John Radcliffe Hospital (until the bridge is repaired).
