# **November Charity Market**

We raised the great sum of £880 on the day and then received a very generous donation the next day to top it up to a thousand pounds. Thank you so much.

# **January Charity Market**

On the 11<sup>th</sup> January 2025 we are holding the market for "**Standing with Giants**". This is a registered charity who create large scale outdoor remembrance art installations individually made from recycled materials by volunteers. These installations provide a meaningful space for people to visit, reflect, grieve, and discuss, bringing individuals together to remember those who fought for freedom, both past and present.

#### **Bus service news**

A new three-year contract was signed in August to support the X34 Didcot to Newbury service, via Chilton. This should ensure the service continues until 2027, so it's up to residents to use it and make it viable beyond then if the subsidy is not extended.

The £2 fare cap for single journeys by bus will be increased to £3 from the beginning of January. Note, the £2 cap was due to finish at the end of 2024. By continuing it at £3 it will be less of a shock if/when it finishes and regular fares are reintroduced, which have been increasing in the background.

Oxfordshire County Council has been awarded £9.35 million for 2025/6 under the government's Bus Service Improvement Plan (BSIP). The County Council's public transport team is now identifying projects to support through the BSIP funding.

# 2024 Poppy Appeal, Chilton

House to house collections in Chilton plus the boxes and collecting tins in the Curie Avenue shops and businesses raised a total of £1,721.32 for the 2024 Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal. We also collected £252.50 by QR codes across the district. # The Lydia Thomas Chilton Gift Fund

Are you aged 74 or more? The Trustees of the Lydia Thomas Chilton Gift Fund are looking forward to visiting some of the senior citizens of Chilton on or around New Year's Day to distribute parcels of groceries or baskets of fruit provided by the Fund.

The distribution of these gifts is an annual event and in January this year we were delighted to be able to supply 34 gifts because of the generous donations from kind parishioners which swelled the Fund.

We always welcome donations from parishioners to increase our budget. Donors may specify whether they would like their gift to be spent in the current year or whether they would prefer the Trustees to invest the gift to enhance our spending power in future years. Donations by cheque would be welcome (made payable to 'Lydia Thomas Chilton Gift Fund'). Alternatively, if you would prefer to give by bank transfer, please contact Hazel Benton or Pam Rolls so that they can give you the bank account details.

The Trustees are also glad to hear of any potential new recipients — to qualify recipients must be aged 74 or over and have lived in Chilton (including Chilton Field) for at least 6 months. Please let us know if a family member, neighbour or friend is eligible.

If any of our existing recipients would like to change from groceries to a basket of fruit, or from fruit to groceries, please let one of the Trustees know as soon as possible. We will be ordering the goods in mid-December.

A little background information: Lydia Thomas was a benefactress of Chilton who died in 1807 and provided in her will the sum of £333-6-8d in 3% Consols for distribution of £10 each New Year's Day for the benefit of the poor. The endowment was administered by the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Parish and used for a distribution of goods, usually of loaves of bread. It is believed that Lydia lived at the Malt House in Main Street. In 1975 the Fund was amalgamated with the Chilton Aid Fund (set up in 1955) to form the present day Fund. The Chilton Aid Fund arose from the Chilton share of the proceeds of the sale of the Nurse's House administered in connection with the Harwell and Chilton Nursing Association. That charity was comprised in a conveyance dated 1926.
