Road Closures in Chilton 13th January 2025

The Parish Council has received a traffic notification from Oxfordshire County Council regarding the upcoming road closure on 13th January. Advanced warning signs have been installed at the extents of Chilton Village.

The Project Lead from Milestone Infrastructure has advised that the closure will be in place between 09.30 and 15.30 to facilitate carriageway patching works to Townsend, Church Hill, Main Street & Lower Road. Work will include localised surfacing repairs to the carriageway and 'siding out' removal of debris build-up against road Controlled edges/kerbing. access will maintained for all residents/businesses within the closure, there may be periods of short delay or requests for a particular point of entry/exit but this is expected to be minimal, all directly affected properties will receive frontage letter in advance of the teams attendance. Access will also be maintained for all bus services, who are already aware of the protocols required. If there are any issues on the day residents should request to speak to the Milestone Site Supervisor.

The patch repairs are preparation works for a follow up surface treatment 'Surface Dressing' which will treat the entire carriageway and is expected to be installed in the Spring of 2025 (dates for this are tbc approx. April/May).
