Chilton County Primary School Nursery class

We currently have spaces in our onsite nursery, for children who are turning 3 years old. All children aged 3 and 4 years are entitled to 15 hours of government funded nursery provision, currently split across 5 mornings. Our nursery is run by a qualified teacher, supported by an experienced nursery nurse. Children follow the Early Years curriculum and attend our onsite Forest School weekly. If you are interested in a place, please contact the school office on 01235 834263 to arrange a tour.

Moving forward, we are considering offering an option for families who might be interested in transitioning from the current 5 mornings a week to 3 days of nursery care, running from 8.45am (with soft drop off) to 3.15pm. This is a total of 19.5 hours per week. Parents would be able to put the free 15 hours of government funding towards the 3 full days, but there would be an additional cost for the remaining 4.5 hours and lunch (if taken). Vale of White Horse District Councillors

Hello from Hayleigh and Debra. We hope you've had an excellent start to the year!

All the parishes will be happy to note that finally a new planning application has been submitted for the GP surgery on Great Western Park. Assuming planning permission is given, Woodlands (who will run this surgery) will be working with their chosen developer to build it.

During the first week of February, the government announced which councils will have postponed elections and therefore be on a fast track to their new devolution deal. Oxfordshire was not one of them and so county council elections will be going ahead this year. It is not clear what form a new unitary authority would take here. An Oxfordshire wide one would be larger than the government has recommended. There have been suggestions of two authorities in Oxfordshire - with a larger Oxford and a doughnut around the outside. It will not be the current councils or the public who decide but it is important we make our views known. At the end of January, ahead of the announcement Cllr Bethia Thomas, leader of the Vale wrote to Cllr Liz Leffman, leader of Oxfordshire County Council with her views (available on the Vale website).

When the government decides what new structure we will take, there will likely be more elections – expected in 2027.

Changes coming this spring to the garden waste service

Residents who use the garden waste service in South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse districts will have a change to their service subscriptions this year. The Councils are introducing a permit scheme from April 2025 that will involve customers receiving a sticker permit for their bins to identify them as fully paid-up garden waste customers. This kind of scheme is offered successfully by many other local authorities, including in West Oxfordshire.

When the new system goes live, all existing customers will be notified directly, with full information on the council websites and each house getting a bin hanger flagging the changes. Customers will then need to make an annual payment for a permit – this replaces the existing direct debit scheme. Everyone's payment year will run from 1 April to 31 March each year.

Vale pledges to represent local communities following reservoir announcement

Following the recent announcement from the Chancellor, which includes support for Thames Water's proposed new reservoir near Abingdon, the Leader of the Vale of White Horse District Council has pledged to do everything she can to represent the views of residents and businesses across the district.

February Update from Olly Glover, MP

'The severe weather in January brought flooding challenges for many, and I've been in touch with local councils to ensure your concerns are addressed.

It was a busy month in Parliament, with debates on local, national, and international issues. I voted in favour of The WASPI Bill, supporting women affected by retirement age changes, the Climate and Nature Bill, a priority many of you asked me to

support, and the Sunshine Bill, ensuring solar panels put on new homes. I've raised concerns about medication shortages for epilepsy, ADHD, and Parkinson's patients, and I was pleased to show support for our local post offices. Education featured heavily this month, and I spoke about the need to improve services for children with special needs. Local school visits were inspiring, and the students at Didcot Girls School gave me a grilling as strong as we see in parliament! I also praised the Bikeability scheme, teaching cycling safety in schools.

At my MP surgeries and at local events, I've met constituents, addressing issues such as affordable housing, the management of new estates, and transport. The Chancellor's recent statement and her very public support for the reservoir has caused concern. I continue to push for a public inquiry – the anguish of those affected by flooding and the rise in water bills is a clear signal that Thames Water does not have the trust of those of us living locally.

My team and I continue to serve constituents in addressing a wide range of personal matters. Please contact me if you need support or would like to meet or wish to invite me to a local event (I can't make them all, but I try to fit in as many as I can)!'
