#### **Update from The Crown**

Thanks for all your support in recent weeks, it's been lovely to see so many smiling faces coming in and supporting us, and we hope you are enjoying what we have done so far.

At the moment, our decorators are painting the outside of the pub, and gradually refurbishing or replacing the rotten windows. New signage will shortly be arriving too, and the pub will really look spic and span.

We have hit a small hurdle in our work on the new kitchen. Unfortunately, it would appear that the electrics in the pub are not fit for purpose, and rather than relying on bottled LPG, which is prohibitively expensive, we need to install 3 Phase electricity. SSE have quoted over £12,000 just to run a cable from outside, and with the associated works to connect and distribute/rewire, we're looking at around £20,000, which is a big chunk of what we had assigned for the new kitchen. If anyone has any ideas on what we can do, please let us know! In time, we would like to make the pub as sustainable as possible and use solar and batteries to lessen our carbon footprint, so a long-term solution is needed.

We'll shortly be offering weekday lunches at The Crown - ploughman's, charcuterie boards, soup and sandwiches, and full bar of course! We are looking at running these Tuesday to Friday, with our hot food offering outside Friday evening and all day at weekends. Watch this space! We'd love to know what Chiltonians think, and if they would support weekday daytimes. It's really important to us that The Crown is a hub for everyone, and we think that some of our mature customers might prefer coming in during the day instead of at night, or both! We're also totally up for local groups, organisations and charities meeting at the pub during the day as well - please speak to Katy, email on hello@thecrownatchilton.co.uk or call the pub on 01235 634090 for more info. We also have great barista coffee and will also be offering cakes soon, so why not have your coffee morning or get together at The Crown? We're just looking at covering the cost of opening during weekday daytimes, and if the demand is there, we'll be here to serve you with a smile. Opening on Mondays is part of our plans as well, but we'll get weekday lunches running first.

Lastly, some of you might have seen a Permission in Principle (PiP) application to build a new house on the former small raised beer garden area behind the pub. This land is being sold by the previous landlord separate to the pub. The PIP will be able to be viewed on the Vale of White Horse Planning Application Register:



### Vale of White Horse District Councillors Hello from Hayleigh and Debra:

'It's hard to believe, but we are halfway through our four-year term on the council. As you may have seen from our monthly updates, at the end of 2024, the government produced a white paper on "Devolution" outlining their plans to change the structure of local government. Things have been moving quite quickly and the Vale of White Horse District Council has a preliminary proposal, working together with South Oxfordshire District Council and West Berkshire Council. All councils in the country will have to submit their final proposals by November. What it means in practice, if it all goes ahead, is that Vale of White Horse Council will not exist as we know it in 2 years' time. There will be a new council, with fewer councillors.

As you know, there was a general election in July 2024 which saw big changes both locally and nationally. Locally, we elected a Lib Dem MP for the first time and nationally we saw a change of the government. Councils are already beginning to feel the effects of the Labour government as they push forward with their manifesto on topics such as Local Government Reorganisation, housing targets and changes to the planning system.

Additionally, the Liberal Democrats won a majority, by getting over half of the seats, on Oxfordshire County Council at the 1<sup>st</sup> May local elections. Cllr Rebekah Fletcher is the new Lib Dem county councillor for Harwell, Western Valley and Blewbury which is a very similar area covered by Hayleigh and Debra.

Although Debra and Hayleigh are elected as ward councillors for Blewbury and Harwell, they may also hold roles on the council outside of this. As in previous years, Hayleigh serves as Chair of the Climate Emergency Advisory Committee and a member of the scrutiny committee. She also sits as the council's representative on the Didcot Powerhouse Advisory Board.

As district councillors, we are expected to attend the Vale of White Horse Full Council meetings where we can bring motions to council or ask questions. Over the last year we have continued to ask questions and push for answers regarding the missing GP surgery on Great Western Park. As you will see later in this report, this continued pushing has finally led to some success.

#### **Oxfordshire County Councillors**

Following division boundary changes prior to the recent elections, Chilton is now divided between two Oxfordshire County Councillors.

Cllr Jane Hanna, (Charlton, Ardington and the Hendreds) has responsibility for the area of the village west of the A34 including Chilton Field, Avon Road and Newbury Road.

Cllr Rebekah Fletcher, (Harwell, Western Valley & Blewbury) has responsibility for the old village to the east of the A34.

Both Jane and Rebekah came to our recent Annual Parish Meeting and introduced themselves and have assured us that they will be working closely together for the benefit of our village.

#### Message from Olly Glover, MP

'In recent weeks, I've been focused on Planning. I was appointed to the Planning and Infrastructure Bill Committee. I have advocated for amendments to protect nature, ensure genuinely affordable housing with necessary infrastructure, and introduce solar panels above car parks. The committee debated the vital role of planning committees in ensuring transparency and community engagement. While the government may not adopt many amendments, we continue pushing for improvements, and it is important that the government ministers championing the Bill hear the full range of concerns about it.

I also led my first Westminster Hall debate, championing walking and cycling for journeys to school, and urging its prioritisation in the Road Safety Strategy. I raised local examples, including a safe crossing over the A415 in Culham for Europa School students and improvements to the walking and cycling path there, and a much-delayed walking and cycling bridge project over the A34 in Milton, to link Milton Heights and with Milton Park and Milton Village. We discussed safety concerns like pavement parking forcing people using wheelchairs and buggies onto the road and the need for investment in rural cycle and footpaths. Minister Lillian Greenwood is set to visit a local school to observe Bikeability training, which boosts children's confidence in cycling to school. Recent Westminster activities include meeting Lord Vallance to discuss concerns that our local area may not benefit from the proposed 'Oxford to Cambridge Growth Corridor', and summing up a debate on St George's Day, where I referenced Dragon Hill in Uffington and The George pub in Upton. I also participated in a debate on estate management fees affecting new residents and raised questions with ministers on various local concerns, including export license processing for businesses, stalking protections, small transgender rights, and the lack of coordination in roadworks.

I was glad to meet residents in Wantage and Didcot at my advice surgeries, visit Church Street and Newbury Street GP practices, celebrate VE Day in Wantage, and visit Linda Benton's art exhibition championing beautiful and old local trees in Didcot and East Hagbourne.

Residents in Didcot and nearby villages continue to struggle with GP appointments. While staff funding is one issue, another is the missing GP surgery on Great Western Park. Now that Vale District Council has granted planning permission, I will meet with the developer and the ICB to ensure progress.

Alongside my regular appointment-based surgeries, I am planning drop-in sessions in some villages this summer – look out for details of the dates and times.
