From humble beginnings...

Built on land made available by the Atomic Energy Research Establishment (AERE), Chilton Primary School enabled the children of the village, as well as those whose parents worked on the AERE site, to be educated under one roof. With 86 children, four classes and a budget of just £90 to equip the school, Chilton Primary School officially opened its doors to pupils for the first time on 2nd of October 1950. By 1965, the school welcomed over 200 pupils each day from Chilton and beyond - it even had a swimming pool!

Now, our school has 12 classes and over 300 aspirational, compassionate and enthusiastic pupils who fizz with enthusiasm. We are beyond proud to be celebrating our history and look forward to a bright and exciting future for Chilton Primary School.

As we head into Autumn, with the seasonal changes that brings to the weather, the leaves on the trees and the children returning to school – our workload increasing again. We look forward to the challenges that brings, representing our residents, raising their concerns at council and helping people with their council related issues.

Hayleigh visited the Upton village fete at the start of September, which fortunately had beautiful weather despite the rainy weekends both before and afterwards. It was great to chat with a number of villagers who are working to make their community a lovely place to be. Please do invite us to such events, as we love to go to them!

The Climate continues to be at the top of the Vale Council's agenda, and later this month, groups that made applications to our Climate Action Fund will hear if they were successful. The scheme was well subscribed which just goes to show how much people care about the environment and want to do their bit. Watch this space to find out if one of your local organisations was successful. Awards have been given to Sustainable Blewbury and Little Pippins pre-school in the past, to name a few.

Vale of White Horse and South Oxfordshire district councils are in the top ten performing district councils in the country for taking action on climate and nature recovery, according to research by an environmental organisation. Both councils, which have just published their new joint nature and climate action plan, were rated in the top ten of the Climate Emergency UK's (CEUK) 2025 climate action scorecard:

This has regrettably led to delays in progressing my enquiries over the last month. However, I was able to support Chilton Parish Council at a meeting with our trees officer to discuss maintenance and safety issues. We are back in full swing now and I'm able to push a little bit harder to get remaining enquiries picked up.

Message from Olly Glover, MP

Parliament started sitting on 1st September with a very busy first few weeks for me and my team. At Prime Minister's Questions, I challenged Keir Starmer on the government's decisions to scrap the UK Space Agency - based at Harwell - as an executive body and make it part of a government department. With so many local businesses relying on the Space Sector, I will be keeping an eye on how this change impacts funding and governance. In other debates at Westminster, I raised local concerns about vehicles parking on pavements and spoke about car sharing schemes in rural areas. I also had the pleasure of hosting local teenager, Mikayla, whose charity supports children being treated in hospitals across the UK. My first appearance on ITV's The Last Word gave me the opportunity to talk about the government's cabinet reshuffle and how that impacts on our constituency - for example, I had arranged for the Minister for Future of Roads to join a Bikeability session at a school in Wantage, but that minister is

At a Palestine Solidarity Campaign lobby event, I met with constituents opposing the selling of arms to Israel. Engaging with my constituents on Palestine is vital, and I remain committed to ensuring that their voices are heard in Parliament. Alongside my Liberal Democrat colleagues, I will continue to urge the Government to take action to bring an end to this devastating situation.

no longer in post.

Back in the constituency as well as holding regular surgeries for constituents, I visited the RWE Combined-cycle gas and steam turbine power plant at Milton Park, met with County Council officers to discuss poor broadband coverage in our villages, attended the Wilding and Andrew Service in Wallingford to remember the Canadian servicemen who gave their lives to save the town in 1944, and I met with Post Office staff in Didcot to discuss their challenges and changes to the services they provide.
