Chilton Primary School

We are excited to welcome back pupils and families and are looking forward to hearing about everyone's summer adventures. We have a wonderful term ahead of us, where the children will explore some interesting topics to answer their enquiry questions:

Our reception children will go on a walk to spot the signs of autumn, considering 'What if there was only one season?', and will also visit the church, as they study the Harvest festival, to explore 'What makes a happy planet?'.

Key Stage One are asking 'Who should we listen to?'. They will be learning about the events surrounding the Gunpowder Plot, where Protestant King James was the intended target of conspirators, and the Great Fire of London, where Samuel Pepys recommended houses be pulled down to stop the spread of the fire, but Lord Bloodworth - the Mayor of London - refused such 'destruction'.

Our Lower Key Stage Two children are considering 'What makes a great leader?'. Exploring the Maya civilisation, they will learn about Pakal the Great, who became King at a young age but proved to be a formidable leader.

In Upper Key Stage Two, children will explore ancient Greek democracy, asking 'Was Greek democracy a success?'. They will consider how the roots of democracy in ancient Greece have changed in modern-day society.

As the old adage goes, 'it takes a village'. We are always so pleased to welcome members of the community into school, whether reading with our children, helping us with cooking sessions or sharing your knowledge. <u>Christmas Gifts for Injured Soldiers in</u> Ukraine

This Christmas marks the third year that we are uniting to bring comfort to Ukraine's wounded soldiers. Each gift is more than a present - it is a message of gratitude, love and hope. These brave men and women have made huge sacrifices defending their country and our freedom, and together we can remind them they are not forgotten. With your help, we will deliver warmth, care, and dignity to hospital wards across Ukraine.

If you would like to help, you are invited to pack a shoe box for an injured soldier. The soldiers have suffered severe, life-changing injuries, and are in rehab hospitals often a very long way from home. They are mostly men, but there are some women.

Please fill a shoe box with:

- something to wear socks, warm hat, gloves,
- something to do small game (not language dependent), puzzle, airfix kit (avoid military), notebook, pens, art materials
- treats to eat biscuits, chocolates, sweets, durable cake
- maybe some nice toiletries, but not everyday things - they can get toothpaste, shower gel etc in the hospital
- a Christmas card with simple message happy Christmas, thinking of you, with love ----- / the ----- family

Please wrap the OUTSIDE OF THE BOX AND LID SEPARATELY - but not the contents - so that they receive a brightly wrapped box/lid. No need to list contents, just make sure the lid is removable.

Vale of White Horse District Councillors Hello from Hayleigh and Debra:

We hope you have enjoyed a wonderful summer with warm weather locally, and hopefully some time spent off work relaxing with loved ones.

In July, Vale of White Horse District Council had its full council meeting. Items on the agenda included, approving developer funding (known as \$106) to be used for a community park in Steventon and a Games area in Drayton and two motions relating to the Planning and Infrastructure Bill – one about the proposed changes that will have a negative impact on democracy within planning decisions – removing some decision making power from Planning Committees and the other on changes that will remove environmental protection. We strongly believe that Planning Committees bring value and local knowledge to the planning process and rarely slow down delivery of housing. To read more, head to the Vale website:

It's clear that for more energy security and cheaper electricity, we need to have large renewable energy schemes. A way to get more local communities supporting them, they must come along with prescribed benefits for those communities. We believe the Government should provide a framework for what those benefits look like – whether it's a % of the profits, options to buy shares, money towards local infrastructure or cheaper energy bills.

Finally, as councillors, we continue to push the BOB ICB to deliver its promise to provide a GP surgery at Great Western Park. To read more, head to the Vale website:

Jane and Rebekah are working closely together for the benefit of our village.

A Message from your MP, Olly Glover

Over the summer, I have enjoyed visiting many local organisations and speaking to residents in some of the villages across our constituency.

I was very pleased with the attendance at my summer surgeries in Sutton Courtenay, Uffington, Stanford in the Vale, Moulsford, Blewbury, Didcot, Clifton Hampden, and Letcombe Regis: thank you to everybody who took the time to come and discuss a huge range of topics and concerns.

Alongside summer surgeries, I visited places I have been meaning to for some time and seen a wide range of the activities that take place in our local area. I saw the scientific progress being made on Harwell Campus: from exciting startups like Astron Systems, Oxford Dynamics, and Space Solar, to local outposts of major organisations like the UK Space Agency.

I spent an eye-opening shift with Thames Valley Police, saw the work happening to renovate the Wantage Community Hospital, and met representatives from the NHS regional Integrated Care Board to push for progress on the new GP Surgery at Great Western Park, as key to further progress lies with the regional NHS. Be it championing greater support for community policing or new primary care capabilities to keep up with local housing growth, there is still much for me and others to do to support our public sector and address the pressures they face.

Still, there has been time to appreciate the best of our area in the summer sunshine. I was very grateful to drop in on Truck Festival, to hear about the fantastic ways they combine charity and welfare commitments with putting on a good time. I narrowly avoided a game of 'sponge the MP' at TRAIN's Didcot Youthfest, where young people were connected with vital projects to support their wellbeing. There was even a moment to hone my farming skills with a combine harvester ride amongst the early August showers.

Parliament resumes in September, and I look forward to representing there with renewed energy, and to keep working on your behalf.
