News from Chilton Primary School

I am delighted to be able to write this report at the beginning of a very exciting new chapter at Chilton Primary School.

School Expansion

Admission and organisation

From September 2016 the school will expand to take 45 children into Reception, an increase of 15 on our previous Pupil Admission Number of 30. This increase will turn the school form a one form entry to one and a half form entry. For many years there has been one class for each school year; going forward this will be a little more complicated! At the moment we are just focussing on having two parallel Reception classes in September, and we will make annual changes to the school structure to reflect our pupil numbers. Looking ahead, it would seem most likely that *eventually* the school will be organised with two Reception classes, three mixed-year parallel classes in each of Year 1 and Year 2, Year 3 and 4 and Year 5 and 6.

Building development

A project for building development is in place, led by Oxfordshire County Council and their premises

partner, Carillion. The first phase of this is to develop additional toilets for the new Reception class. These will be created in the existing Food Technology Room. The actual classroom space will be the current Library, which will be relocated in the large alcove area off the corridor. This phase will also include the development of a staff office area in part of the old ICT Suite, currently Music Room, with the remaining space renamed as a multi-purpose Studio. These works are due to be completed by September 2016.

The second phase of the building development is the establishment of a new three-classroom block. This block will include a new Food Technology Room and a small pupil withdrawal room. These works are due to be completed by September 2017.

Teaching School Designation

Chilton Primary School has been selected to become a National Teaching School. Teaching Schools take a leading role in recruiting and training new entrants to the profession. They identify and develop leadership potential; they provide support for other schools, and work with schools across their alliance to raise standards of teaching. Chilton is one of 54 schools in England to be granted teaching school status in the latest round.

Introduced in 2011, Teaching Schools are all rated as "outstanding". They work with partner schools in an alliance to ensure high quality school-led initial teacher training and professional development opportunities for teachers at all stages of their career. Teaching Schools raise standards through supporting other schools, engage in research and development, and ensure that the most talented school leaders are spotted and supported to become successful headteachers.

The National College for Teaching and Leadership (NCTL) has responsibility, in partnership with headteachers from the Teaching Schools Council, for the designation and quality of the teaching schools programme. The latest designation round takes the number of Teaching Schools to over 700. Roger Pope, Chair of the National College for Teaching and Leadership, said:

"I'd like to congratulate Chilton Primary School - they should be very proud of this achievement. Teaching schools have shown themselves to be at the heart of school improvement. They're supporting other schools, attracting and training the best new teachers and developing the next generation of leaders. At NCTL, we want to do all we can to support their work."

We are very proud of this achievement and excited about the opportunities that this new status will offer us.

Outdoor Learning is central to what we do at Chilton. Dr Helen Bilton and Dr Anne Crook have written a book, *Exploring Outdoors*, based on a year at Chiton! We also have a visit and residential programme for all the children: this year Year 6 have spent a week at Yenworthy in Devon, and over the next few weeks Years 3 and 4 are going to Hooke Court in Dorset and Years 1 and 2 are having an adventure at Hill End, with Year 2 sleeping there. It was inspirational to listen to the exciting and amazing adventures of Explorer, Sarah Outen. Sarah came in to talk to the whole school about her incredible journey around the world, by kayak, bicycle and rowing boat. We are now all inspired to be outside and be more active, and of course, have more adventures.


The school grounds are always being developed: this year, with a generous donation from the PTA, we have been able to renew the netball court markings and install a Multi-Sport Ball Wall. Chiltonbury (a FREE Music Event) is on Saturday 2nd July – please come along, have a fun day and evening **and** support your local school as we save for another element in our ever-growing Trim Trail.

We work closely with All Saints' Church to provide a special week of reflection every year. This year the Mindfulness/Prayer Space is being held in June and we look forward to welcoming members of the Church community who support us with this.





Monthly Produce Market and Charity Stall






Oxfordshire Artweeks


Chilton WI
