Chilton School Annual Report 2016-17

Our Thriving Village School

Chilton School is an exciting and purposeful place to learn, and this year has been particularly successful as we begin to grow in numbers and prepare for the significant changes to come. Last summer four teachers left Chilton for reasons of relocation, retirement, retraining and promotion. We have successfully appointed new teachers who have embraced Chilton's approach to teaching and learning and have all proved to be excellent practitioners. Chilton is both a National Teaching School and a National Support School. We work within Oxfordshire Teaching Schools Alliance to provide Continuing Professional Development for teachers across Oxfordshire and support other schools locally.

Learning at Chilton

Our thematic and creative curriculum has involved the children learning about a very wide range of topics. Here is a taster of some of the topics over the last year: I'm a Celebrity (famous people through the ages), Yabba Dabba Do (the Stone Age), Off with Her Head (the Tudors), ROAR! Here Come the Dinosaurs and The Future's Bright...the Future's Didcot (Local Study). Children enjoy their learning and are engaged with the topics, often producing work of high quality. We know this because we welcome many visitors from other schools, actively ask other headteachers to monitor our work and host training days for teachers from across Oxfordshire; we always receive very positive feedback about all aspects of the school.

We have worked hard to enhance and enrich the curriculum. Learning outside is a very important strand at Chilton. Every child gets an opportunity to spend three or four afternoons in the Forest School area (in one corner of the school grounds), and Nursery and Reception children visit Forest

School throughout the year. All children have external trips and visits, and this year these have included a four-night residential to Yenworthy Lodge in Devon, and visits to Stonehenge, a mosque, House of Parliament, Winchester Science Centre, the British Museum together with theatre trips to Oxford and to the Cornerstone.

Expansion Update

The school's expansion began in September 2016 as we welcomed 45 new four year-old children in our two small Reception classes. With small classes of 23 or 22, as opposed to the usual 30 children in a class, we are able to give the youngest children the very best foundation to their learning journey. To accommodate these additional children we created a new Reception class, by moving the well-stocked refurbished library back to its original home. These new classes begin our new Chilton tradition of every class having a Tree name; so far we have Oak and Maple.

Early indications suggest that we will have 45 more new children joining our school in September, but with no empty classroom this time, we are dependent on Oxfordshire County Council (OCC) delivering us a new three-classroom extension. Unfortunately this work is already delayed, and will not be ready for September. We are working with the project team to agree mitigation. OCC does not have full control of this project, as it works in partnership with Carillion and Capita; you may have read about the issues surrounding this contract and the impact building delays are having in schools across the county. Unfortunately for Chilton School, these delays mean that we are going to have a disjointed year as we temporarily accommodate a class in the old ICT Suite while living with a major building project in our grounds.

Getting involved

The school is open to involvement from the local community and welcomes visitors. We are always looking for volunteers to help with our school garden project or support in Forest School (Tuesdays and Thursdays), and we are keen to employ more lunch time supervisors. Please get in touch if you are interested!

We have a supportive and active Governing Body and a vibrant Parent Teacher's Association. As the school grows these volunteers will play an increasingly vital role. We currently have about 250 children on roll; over the next five years the school will grow to one and half form entry, with 45 in every year, and there will be almost 350 children at Chilton School.

We will keep you informed, through The Chronicle, as the school changes and grows. This is the very beginning of an exciting time for the school, and for the whole community.



Starts Monday 5 June, 10am-11am Chilton Recreation Ground




