

## Up in the Downs

## A Portrait of Chilton



A unique record of Chilton village up to the year 2000 was published as the book "UP IN THE DOWNS". It was written and edited by Frank Dumbleton with contributions from other members of the village and published by Chilton Parish Council in 2000. This was a unique snapshot of the village and its inhabitants through the 20<sup>th</sup> Century

All copies of the original publication were sold and it is currently not available to purchase. Since the book's publication, 18 years ago, there has, inevitably been a significant movement in the population of the village — people have moved away either by choice or destiny and others have come in to take their place. We also have had an increase in the population of the village with the development at Chilton Field. Some of us, who were in the village at the time of publication, allowed the opportunity to purchase a copy to pass us by — for whatever reason.

Chilton is a very vibrant and friendly village and newcomers are always encouraged to participate. This has the inevitable effect of generating interest in comparing the village as it is now with previous times and the *UP in the Downs* book goes a long way to satisfy this interest certainly at a significant point in time – i.e. the Millennium. It is believed that now would be an excellent time to consider a reprint of the book so that more people can gain an understanding of the life of Chilton during the last century.

We have investigated the costs of having the book reprinted and find that it could be made available at a price of £12 to £13 per copy if a minimum of 50 copies could be sold.
