Bellringing

All Saints' Church bells were restored for the Millenium. Since then we have tried to ring the bells weekly for the Sunday morning service. We also ring the bells for cheerful occasions such as weddings, and sad occasions when we may toll the tenor bell for a funeral, for the number of times showing the person's age. There are also national occasions associated with members of the Royal Family, or local festivities, for example Harwell Bells

are rung to signal the start of the 'Harwell Feast' procession.

1400 bell ringers died during the First World War. We are now trying to recruit more ringers to ring with us on 11 November 2018 to ring in remembrance of the people who died from our village, and help us continue to ring the bells they loved. Find out more on the internet by emailing bells@big-ideas.org. Bells are mounted on Wheels, around which there are ropes. To ring, all you have to do is pull the bell rope down straight. The bell itself does most of the work, you just give it a small pull to keep it swinging. Each ringer controls one bell which is rung at the correct time with respect to the other ringers so that the bells ring in a pleasant sequence. It takes a little time to learn when to pull. We have a Training officer who arranges practice sessions for new ringers on Saturday mornings in local towers.

You need no longer be a couch potato, join us in having some exercise, the ringers are sociable people, you can chat to them while resting, when you go on holiday you will be welcome to ring in their tower; it costs very little, unlike golf when you have to buy a set of clubs and pay a large membership.
