Chilton's Loop – improving local transport

A word of introduction to Loop; a new service that we are piloting in a number of local villages later this summer. Loop has been developed in close consultation with the parish councils and local residents clustered around Wallingford and Didcot to provide a sustainable, on-demand service that matches drivers and passengers travelling to and from local amenities. With the removal and/or sparsity of buses and high cost of taxis, living in rural communities can be both isolating and expensive. Loop has been designed as a social enterprise that can serve communities locally. Loop will reward drivers for providing lifts, get passengers where they want to go, provide financial support for the local community and improve connectivity. We would love to work with Chilton and its residents. Our website and app will be launching in Mid July, so please keep an eye out.
