Fly-tipping – it's not just rubbish, it's criminal – Let's put a stop to it

Did you know that you can report fly-tipping online using the Vale's <u>online form</u>, or telephone **03000 610 610** or email <u>admin.vale@biffa.co.uk</u> or contact your local District Councillor.

What information does the Vale need?

To help the Vale investigate the complaint they need as much detail as possible, including:

- the date, time and the place where the tipping is taking place, or has occurred
- what the waste is and how much of it there is
- a description of any vehicles involved and the registration number if possible

Removing fly-tipping

The Vale is responsible for removing fly-tipped waste from the public highway and highway verges. For information about how fly-tipped waste is dealt with see the Vale's website page on street cleaning.

Overhanging Hedges

Can householders be aware that overhanging hedges, shrubs, bushes cause problems if they encroach onto the pavement or road. Now that everything is starting to grow please check that pedestrians, cars and particularly buses can use the pavements and the roads safely.
